# 72 Hours to Break Free from OxyContin Addiction



A focused 3-day Bible study to find strength, hope, and freedom from OxyContin addiction through God's Word and grace.





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#### Introduction

Welcome to this 3-day Bible study designed specifically for those ready to break free from the grip of OxyContin addiction. Addiction is a powerful struggle that affects both body and spirit, leaving many feeling trapped, hopeless, and alone. But Scripture offers us a lifeline—a path to freedom through God's love, strength, and restoration.

Over the next 72 hours, you will immerse yourself in God's promises and truths that remind you that you are not defined by your addiction, but by the new life available in Christ. These days focus on understanding your worth in God's eyes, relying on His strength when yours is dwindling, and embracing the hope of a transformed future.

During withdrawal and the early stages of recovery, it can be overwhelming and isolating. This study offers practical spiritual support as you face the physical and emotional challenges ahead. Each day includes Scripture passages, devotional reflections, reflection questions, journaling prompts, and prayers to encourage you to lean into God's presence throughout this journey.

**Remember:** God is faithful and compassionate, and He promises never to leave you or forsake you—even in the darkest moments. May these 72 hours be a turning point where you begin to experience His healing power and freedom.

### Devotional: God Provides Strength in Your Weakness

Beginning your journey to break free from OxyContin addiction takes immense courage. Day one focuses on recognizing the battle you face and the strength God provides. Addiction can make you feel weak, defeated, and powerless—but God's Word reminds you that you are not alone in this struggle.

Psalm 34:17 assures us that when we cry out, God hears us and delivers us from our troubles. This promise invites you to openly bring your fears, pains, and cravings before Him today. No matter how deep the addiction seems, God's power can break chains.

Isaiah 41:10 encourages you not to fear because God is with you, offering His strength to carry you through the difficult moments. When withdrawal symptoms arise or temptation feels overwhelming, lean on this truth. Weakness is not failure; it is an opportunity for God's grace to manifest.

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians remind us that God's power is most evident when we feel weak. Do not be discouraged by your limitations—allow God to work through them. Today, take your first step by surrendering control and asking God to be your strength.

# **Journaling Prompts**

	Write about the moment you realized you needed God's help with your addiction.
2.	List areas where you feel weak and invite God to meet you there.
3.	Describe what it means to you to rely on God's strength instead of your own.







### Prayer for Today

**Father,** I come before You feeling weak and overwhelmed by this addiction. Today, I surrender my fears and ask for Your strength to carry me. Help me to remember that I am not alone and that Your grace is enough for me. When temptation comes, remind me that Your power is made perfect in my weakness. Please stand with me in this battle and lead me toward freedom. Thank You for hearing my cries and delivering me from my troubles. *In Jesus' name, Amen.*

#### Devotional: Hope and Healing Are Fully Yours Today

The journey of breaking free from addiction can seem endless, but God's promise of hope shines brightly through your darkest moments. Today is about embracing the healing that begins when you place your trust in Him.

Jeremiah 29:11 offers a profound promise: God knows the plans He has for your life—plans filled with hope, restoration, and a future not defined by addiction. This message invites you to believe that your past does not dictate your destiny.

Romans 15:13 reminds us that God is the source of true joy and peace, even amid struggle. As you trust Him today, ask Him to fill your heart with this joy and peace, which the world can neither give nor take away.

3.	List signs of God's healing grace you sense in your life today.







### Prayer for Today

**Lord,** thank You for the hope You offer me in this journey. Help me to hold tightly to the promise that You have plans to prosper me and give me a hopeful future. Fill my heart with joy and peace as I trust in You through the challenges ahead. Restore my soul with Your grace and remind me that healing is possible because of Your love. # Devotional: Living in Freedom as More Than Conquerors
