Devotional: The Power of Words in Marriage

Words have the power to either build up or tear down. In the intimacy of marriage, how we communicate deeply affects the health of the relationship. Ephesians 4:29 reminds us to speak only what benefits and encourages, reflecting God's love through our conversations.

Often, couples fall into patterns of criticism or harshness, unintentionally wounding each other. But God calls us to be quick to listen and slow to anger (James 1:19), cultivating patience and grace. When frustrations arise, choosing a gentle answer (Proverbs 15:1) can diffuse tension and open the door for understanding.

Take time today to evaluate the tone and content of your conversations with your spouse. Are your words uplifting, or do they need refining? Pray for the Holy Spirit to help you communicate with kindness and wisdom, reflecting Christ's love in every exchange.

Devotional: Living Out Biblical Love in Marriage

Devotional: Building Unbreakable Unity in Marriage
