Devotional: Embracing God's Invitation to Wisdom

Day 2: \to Humility: The Key to Growth

Your Verse

- Philippians 2:3 "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves."
- Isaiah 66:2 "These are the ones I look on with favor: those who are humble and contrite in spirit, and who tremble at my word."







Day 2: \to Humility: The Key to Growth

Devotional: Humility Unlocks True Wisdom

Today's focus is on humility, the foundation of a teachable heart. Proverbs 11:2 warns us that pride obstructs wisdom, but humility opens the door for it to flourish. Pride creates resistance to learning, because it insists on self-sufficiency and often dismisses the need for correction.

In contrast, humility is recognizing our limitations and valuing God's instruction above our own understanding. Philippians 2:3 teaches us to consider others and approach life with a selfless attitude, which reflects a heart ready to listen and learn.

God favors those who are humble and contrite, as Isaiah 66:2 reminds us. A contrite spirit reflects deep awareness of our need for God's mercy and a desire to align our lives with His Word. When we tremble at God's Word, it shows reverence and respect—another indicator of a teachable heart.

Humility is not weakness; it is strength under God's guidance. It enables us to face correction without defensiveness and encourages ongoing growth in faith and character.

Day 3: Fembracing Correction for Growth

Your Verse

Proverbs 12:1 - "Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but whoever hates correction is stupid."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 12:11 "No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it."
- 2 Timothy 3:16 "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness."







Day 3: F Embracing Correction for Growth

Devotional: Welcoming God's Loving Correction

Correction is essential to spiritual growth and the cultivation of a teachable heart. Proverbs 12:1 starkly points out that loving discipline is linked to loving knowledge, while rejecting correction shows foolishness. The journey of faith involves being shaped through God's loving discipline.

Hebrews 12:11 acknowledges the difficulty of discipline in the moment but promises a fruitful outcome: righteousness and peace. When we embrace correction, even when uncomfortable, we align ourselves more closely with God's purposes and experience His refining work.

2 Timothy 3:16 emphasizes that Scripture itself serves multiple purposes—including correcting and training us in righteousness. A teachable heart recognizes the authority of God's Word to set us straight and lead us forward.

Today, let us choose to welcome God's correction as a loving gift rather than a rebuke. By doing so, we allow Him to transform us into vessels of His glory and wisdom.
