Day 1: W God's Family By Adoption

Your Verse

Ephesians 1:5 - "He predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will."

Day 1: W God's Family By Adoption

Devotional: Chosen and Loved by God through Adoption

Day 2: The Divine Family Model

Devotional: Belonging Through Faith in Jesus Christ

To be part of God's family is a privilege granted to those who receive Jesus in faith. John reminds us that believing in Jesus gifts us the right to become children of God—a spiritual adoption that grants access to the Father's love.

God's family isn't just a metaphor; it's a living reality marked by relationship. We are lavished with His love and given a new identity. This family transcends natural lineage and cultural boundaries to unite all believers in one spiritual household.

- Psalm 68:5 "A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in his holy dwelling."







Devotional: Living God's Compassion for the Fatherless

God's heart beats for the vulnerable, especially orphans and those without family. The Bible consistently calls His people to imitate this compassionate concern. James declares that caring for orphans is part of true, pure religion—an outward expression of God's love in action.

Spiritual adoption mirrors this divine heart. As God adopts us, He calls us to stand with those similarly marginalized by society—those without earthly families or stable homes.

Reflecting God's care means more than sympathy; it involves tangible acts of kindness, justice, and advocacy. When we care for the fatherless, we embody God's character and witness to His kingdom's values.

Consider how your faith might call you to love and serve those needing family and belonging, embodying the heart of God through your actions.

Day 4: **B** New Identity in Christ

Devotional: Embracing New Life and Identity in Christ

Adoption into God's family ushers in a radical new identity. Paul reminds us that in Christ, we become new creations—old labels and broken pasts are replaced by the newness of life and belonging.

This spiritual transformation means being clothed in God's attributes: compassion, kindness, humility, and above all, love. We live not by our own strength but by the identity God gives us as His dearly loved children.

Recognizing this new identity invites us to live differently—with the humility and compassion that reflect God's heart and the acceptance He extends to us. It also offers freedom from past shame or insecurity, as we now see ourselves through God's eyes.

Take time today to meditate on the power of becoming a new creation and how that shapes the way you live in community and family.
