Devotional: Trusting God's Faithfulness in Prophecy

The Advent season reminds us of the many prophecies that foretold Jesus' coming. These prophetic words from Isaiah, Micah, and Jeremiah assure us that God's plan was established from the beginning and is unshakable.

Devotional: God's Love Shown Through Humble Beginnings
