#### Devotional: Finding Rest for the Weary Soul

In a culture that values productivity and speed, rest can sometimes feel like a luxury or even a weakness. #### Devotional: Knowing Who You Are in Christ

#### Devotional: Surrendering to God's Perfect Timing

In a world that values instant results and immediate gratification, learning to trust God's timing can be challenging. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us there is a right time and season for everything ordained by God. This invites us to release our urgency and embrace patience with faith.

Proverbs 3:5-6 encourages us to trust in the Lord wholeheartedly and avoid relying solely on our own understanding. Often, we rush because we feel the need to control outcomes, yet God's ways are higher and wiser, as Isaiah 55:8-9 teaches us.

**Trusting God's timing means relinquishing control and resting in His sovereign plan.** It requires slowing down our pace and listening for His guidance. When we anchor ourselves in this truth, we experience peace even when seasons differ from our expectations.

Today, practice surrendering your impatience to God and lean into His perfect timing.

#### Devotional: Nurturing Peace Amidst Chaos

Life's fast pace often stirs anxiety and unrest within our hearts. Philippians 4:6-7 offers a powerful antidote: instead of letting anxiety dominate, we are called to prayerfully present our worries to God with thanksgiving. This practice opens the door to the peace of God, which transcends human understanding, guarding our hearts and minds.

Jesus promises in John 14:27 to give us His peace—not as the world gives. His peace is deep, lasting, and able to rule our hearts, as Colossians 3:15 exhorts. Cultivating this peace requires intentional habits: prayer, gratitude, and surrender.

When we anchor in Christ's peace, we can remain calm and centered despite external chaos. This peace roots us deeply so we don't drift away amid stress.

Today, focus on nurturing God's peace as your anchor in every situation you face.

#### Devotional: Growing Stronger Together

Though personal grounding is vital, God also designs us for community. Ecclesiastes 4:9–10 reminds us that we function best together, supporting, encouraging, and lifting each other up. For women walking a fast–paced path, having sisters in Christ provides strength beyond what we can muster alone.

Hebrews 10:24–25 emphasizes the importance of gathering to spur one another on in love and good deeds. Friendship and community sharpen our faith and character, as Proverbs 27:17 paints a beautiful picture of mutual growth.

Community slows us down by providing accountability, encouragement, and shared rest. It anchors us when we might otherwise drift or become isolated under pressure.

Today, consider your current community and how you can both receive and offer support to women around you.
