### Devotional: Extravagant Worship in Humble Surrender

Mary's act of anointing Jesus' feet with costly perfume is a vivid picture of extravagant devotion. In a culture where washing feet was a servant's task, Mary's willingness to humbly anoint and wipe Jesus' feet with her hair speaks of surrender and love beyond social convention or cost. This act teaches us that true worship often involves humility and costly giving.

Her devotion invites us to ask: What are we willing to offer Jesus—our resources, time, reputation, or heart? Are we prepared to worship Him in ways that might be misunderstood or undervalued by others? Mary's focus was entirely on honoring Jesus, without concern for human opinions.

Her example helps us see worship as a deeply personal expression of gratitude and love that flows naturally from a heart touched by Jesus' presence. It encourages us to become people who worship not out of obligation, but from genuine, passionate devotion.

- Matthew 6:1 "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them."







Day 4: D Worship That Provokes Criticism

### Devotional: Remaining Faithful Amid Criticism

Judas's criticism contrasts sharply with Mary's worship. It reveals how expressions of true devotion sometimes face misunderstanding or opposition. Our worship—especially when sincere and costly—may not always be popular or approved by others. This can challenge our faith and commitment.

Paul reminds us that seeking God's approval over people's opinions is essential in maintaining pure worship. Jesus' warning about public displays teaches us to worship with sincerity, not to gain human applause but to honor God genuinely.

It can be tempting to tone down our worship or disguise acts of devotion to avoid criticism. Yet, Mary's example encourages us to hold fast to heartfelt worship, regardless of the voices that challenge it. Reflect on how you handle criticism in your faith journey—does it deter you or deepen your resolve?

Mary's worship was a sweet aroma, a tangible influence that testified to Jesus' worth and mission. Paul calls believers a pleasing aroma of Christ, demonstrating that our acts of devotion announce and attract God's presence to the world.

Our worship affects not only God but people we encounter. It can soften hearts, inspire others, and validate God's love in action. Reflect on how your worship—private and public—casts a fragrance into your surroundings. Is it one that draws others nearer to Christ, or does it repel or confuse?

This calls us to intentionality—cultivating worship that influences for good, rooted in truth, love, and sacrifice.

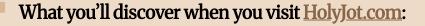




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
