

Devotional: Eloquence Meets Humble Beginning

Apollos's story begins with zeal and knowledge. He was "mighty in the Scriptures" and bold in his teaching. Yet, as powerful as his eloquence was, he still had areas needing growth. His initial impact in Ephesus was remarkable because he knew the Scriptures well and was passionate about the Lord.

Still, we see that he lacked the fullness of truth and understanding until he was taught more accurately by Priscilla and Aquila. This shows that no matter how gifted we are, there's always room to grow and learn. True discipleship involves humility — a willingness to be taught and corrected.

In your own walk, think about the things you know well and areas where you might need to be open to correction. Like Apollos, you have gifts and passions, but God's truth is what ultimately refines and empowers those gifts.

Devotional: Embracing Correction to Grow Deeper

Teachability is the heart attitude that opens us to God's fuller truth. Apollos's story shows us that even when someone is skilled and knowledgeable, their journey in faith and understanding isn't complete without openness to learning.

Priscilla and Aquila's gentle correction and guidance refined Apollos's ministry. It was not a rebuke to diminish him but an invitation to deeper truth. Their mentorship highlights the power of a loving community to shape and sharpen followers of Christ.

Today, consider your own teachability. Are you open to correction from trusted fellow believers? Do you seek God's wisdom daily, knowing your understanding can always expand? God's Word is alive and active; thus, our perspectives must remain flexible and responsive.
