#### Devotional: The Power of Humility in Saying Sorry

#### Devotional: Listening Well Opens the Door to Healing

Sincere apologies begin with listening. James 1:19 reminds us to be quick to listen and slow to speak. Before apologizing, it is important to truly understand the other person's feelings and perspective.

Many conflicts escalate because we offer excuses or defensive responses rather than hearing the hurt we caused. Proverbs teaches that answering before listening leads to folly and unnecessary shame.

When you listen carefully, it shows respect and conveys a genuine desire to reconcile. It also ensures that your apology addresses the real issues and the pain experienced, making it more powerful and healing.

Day 3: O Saying Sorry Without Excuses

#### Your Verse

Psalm 32:5 NIV - "Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the Lord.' And you forgave the guilt of my sin."

#### **Supporting Scriptures**

- Proverbs 28:13 "Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy."
- Matthew 5:23-24 "First be reconciled to your brother or sister."







Day 3: Saying Sorry Without Excuses

#### Devotional: Confess Without Qualification or Excuse

A sincere apology is honest and unreserved. Psalm 32:5 illustrates David confessing his sin without hiding or excusing it. Likewise, Proverbs teaches that concealing or minimizing our wrongs blocks the path to mercy.

When apologizing, resist the tendency to qualify your apology with excuses or justifications. Saying "I'm sorry if you were hurt" distances your responsibility and may deepen wounds instead of healing them.

Jesus calls us to reconciliation, urging that mending relationships is paramount. A pure apology acknowledges the harm caused and expresses genuine regret, opening the way for forgiveness and renewed fellowship.

- Luke 17:3 "If your brother or sister sins against you, rebuke them; and if they repent, forgive them."







#### Devotional: Godly Sorrow: The Basis of True Apology

**True apology involves godly sorrow that leads to repentance.** 2 Corinthians 7:10 contrasts repentance that leads to restoration versus shallow regret that changes nothing.

When we apologize sincerely, our hearts are transformed, not only to admit fault but to turn away from harmful patterns. This repentance is a gift from God that renews us and those we hurt.

Forgiveness flows naturally when repentance is genuine. Luke's teaching reminds us that repentance in relationships invites mercy and restoration, allowing love to flourish once again.

Today, pray for a heart that really repents, not just regrets, so your apologies bring life and healing.

- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone."
- Matthew 6:14 "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you."







Day 5: MReceiving and Offering Forgiveness

#### Devotional: Forgiveness: The Bridge to Reconciliation

**Forgiveness is both a gift to give and to receive.** As we come with sincere apologies, we must also open our hearts to forgive, following God's example in Christ.

Ephesians 4:32 calls us to kindness and compassion, showing that forgiveness is tied closely to empathy. Forgiving releases resentment and enables relationships to grow anew.

Sometimes, receiving forgiveness is as challenging as asking for it. Holding onto hurt creates barriers. By choosing to forgive, we reflect Christ's mercy and invite peace.

Reflect on where forgiveness is needed in your life—both giving and receiving—as part of sincere relationship restoration.

#### Devotional: Kind Words Mend Broken Hearts

An apology filled with kindness and grace encourages reconciliation and invites trust, while harsh or careless words can further wound.

Ephesians reminds us to use words that build others up, reflecting Christ's love. Season your apology with grace, humility, and truth, making it a balm rather than a barrier.
