Authority in Spiritual Warfare: Binding and Loosing



Discover how to wield your spiritual authority through prayer, binding evil and releasing God's will as taught in Matthew 18:18.





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Introduction

Spiritual warfare is a reality every believer faces. It is a battle unseen, fought not with flesh and blood but with divine authority given to us by Christ. One of the most powerful truths in the New Testament is found in *Matthew 18:18*, where Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." This promise speaks directly to our authority as Christians to engage in spiritual warfare effectively through prayer.

Binding refers to restraining or hindering the enemy's works, while loosing means releasing God's blessings, freedom, and will in a given situation. When practiced in prayer and faith, binding and loosing become vital tools to combat the plans of the enemy and establish God's kingdom here on earth.

Throughout this 7-day study plan, you'll learn how to understand, exercise, and live out the authority you have been given. Each day will build on the previous one, helping you grasp spiritual realities, recognize your position in Christ, and confidently stand against spiritual opposition. You will also be equipped to unleash God's redemptive work in your life and around you.

Let this journey empower you to take up your spiritual weapons and actively participate in *binding* darkness and *loosing* light and freedom through prayer. Embrace the authority that Jesus has entrusted to you to transform your spiritual battles into victories as you align with His will. Your prayers matter, your declarations have power, and your faith moves heaven's hand.

Devotional: Grasping Your God-Given Authority

Spiritual authority is a divine empowerment given to every believer through Jesus Christ. When Jesus spoke of binding and loosing in Matthew 18:18, He was granting us the ability to enforce spiritual laws on earth that align with heaven's will.

Day 2: Recognizing the Enemy's Tactics

Devotional: Discern the Enemy's Strategies

To effectively bind and loose, we must know our adversary. The devil is cunning and uses deception, fear, temptation, and lies to disrupt God's purposes. 1 Peter 5:8 warns us to stay alert because the enemy is constantly seeking to devour believers.

Recognizing these tactics helps you identify what to bind in prayer — whether it's fear, discouragement, confusion, or any strategy aimed at weakening your faith. It also clarifies what to loose: truth, peace, joy, and protection derived from God's Word.

When you pray with awareness of the enemy's schemes, your authority becomes sharper and your stand more effective. Remember, we do not fight in our own strength but in the power and authority Jesus provides. Staying vigilant and discerning is key to thriving in spiritual warfare.

Devotional: Command Darkness to Be Restrained

Binding is a deliberate action in prayer to restrict the influence of evil forces. It requires faith, submission to God, and clear declarations according to His Word. Mark 11:23 illustrates the power of speaking in faith — declaring what God commands without doubting.

To bind evil, begin by acknowledging God's sovereignty and submitting yourself fully to Him. Then, identify the specific spiritual strongholds, lies, or temptations you want to restrict. Speak clearly and confidently, commanding these forces to be restrained by the authority of Jesus.

Binding is not about fear or confrontation in our own strength but about exercising spiritual authority aligned with God's will. It's grounding prayer in Scripture, focusing on truth, and trusting God to enforce the binding in heaven.

Devotional: Release God's Freedom and Blessings

Loosing is the act of releasing God's blessings, freedom, healing, and victory into situations. After binding what opposes God's kingdom, the next step is to loose His will by declaring His promises in prayer.

The freedom Jesus offers is total and transformative (John 8:36). By standing on God's Word and trusting His guidance, we open the door for His purposes to manifest in our lives and communities.

Loosing requires faith-filled declarations that align with Scripture—releasing peace, restoration, breakthrough, and salvation. When you pray to loose, you partner with God's Spirit to bring heaven's reality to earth, turning captivity into freedom.
