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Introduction

We are called to live lives that reflect His character, readiness, and love, shining in a world longing for hope.

Through prayer, reflection, and Scripture, may your heart be inflamed with the desire to stay spiritually awake and ready, embracing the joy of His coming and the faithful service He requires.





Day 1: Stay Awake: The Call for Spiritual Alertness



Your Verse

Luke 12:35–40 – “Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning...”

Supporting Scriptures

- *Mark 13:33 – “Be on guard! Be alert! You do not know when that time will come.”*
- *Matthew 24:42 – “Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come.”*



Devotional: Living Alertly in a Distracted World

Spiritual alertness means more than just awareness—it's a posture of readiness, a state of mind and heart that stays fixed on Christ. In Luke 12:35–40, Jesus compares His followers to servants waiting for their master's return, urging them to keep their lamps burning and be dressed for service.

In today's fast-paced and often noisy world, distractions abound. Social media, work pressures, and daily tasks can draw our focus away from the spiritual dimension of our lives. Yet, Jesus commands us to *stay awake*. This watchfulness involves cultivating a deep dependence on the Holy Spirit to keep our hearts sensitive and our eyes fixed on eternity.

Being watchful means more than just waiting; it means living with intentionality and faithfulness. The promise of the master's unexpected return encourages us to examine our lives and align ourselves with God's mission. Are we ready to serve? Are our hearts burning with love and obedience?

Supporting Scriptures

- *John 14:3 – “I will come back and take you to be with me.”*
- *Revelation 16:15 – “Blessed is the one who stays awake.”*



Devotional: Hope and Readiness in the Parable of Virgins

The **Parable of the Ten Virgins** in Matthew 25 highlights the importance of preparation and readiness. Five virgins were wise, bringing extra oil for their lamps, and five were foolish, unprepared when the bridegroom arrived. This story underscores the urgency and individual responsibility in living expectantly for Christ's return.

Jesus teaches that the timing of His return is unknown — it may be soon or delayed. We cannot rely on others to keep us ready; spiritual watchfulness is a personal calling cultivated through prayer, Scripture, and obedience.

Moreover, the promise found in John 14:3 reminds us that Christ's return is sure and loving: He will come back to take us to be with Him. This brings hope that empowers us to persevere even amidst waiting. Revelation 16:15 reinforces the blessing for those who stay awake, encouraging us that vigilant faithfulness is rewarded.

As you meditate on this parable, consider how your oil reservoir (your spiritual strength and readiness) is being filled. Are you actively nurturing your relationship with Christ daily? Expectantly waiting means holding onto hope, walking in obedience, and living with joy as you anticipate the Master's return.

Day 3:  Faithful Service: Being Ready for the Master's Arrival

Devotional: Faithfulness in Service While We Wait


Jesus teaches in Luke 12:42–48 about the **faithful and wise manager** entrusted with the master's household. The faithful servant is ready and obedient, managing responsibilities well while the master is away. This parable reminds us that being watchful also means being faithful in the tasks God has given us right now.

Spiritual readiness isn't just waiting passively; it involves active service, prayer, and living with integrity. 1 Peter 4:7 encourages us to be alert and clear-minded so that our prayers are fervent and effective. Paul's instruction in Colossians 3:23 underlines the attitude we must have: whatever we do, we serve the Lord Himself.

Today, reflect on your role as a watchful servant. Are you faithfully managing the responsibilities God has given you? Are you alert, praying, and living with a heart aimed at pleasing Christ? The master's return calls us to be attentive stewards, ready to give an account and to receive the reward of faithful service.

Let your watchfulness translate into meaningful action and joyful service, knowing the Master comes to a servant who is found doing what he was called to do.
