Devotional: Work Wholeheartedly for God's Glory

Devotional: Depend on God's Wisdom in Decisions

Proverbs reminds us not to lean on human understanding alone but to seek God's direction through prayer and Scripture. Request His wisdom daily, especially when options are unclear or stakes are high. *James assures us He gives generously* without judgment when we ask.

Make seeking God's counsel a non-negotiable habit. This will not only steer your decisions but grow your dependence on Him, protecting you from pride and impulsiveness. When you pause and seek God first, He often reveals paths you wouldn't have considered.
