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Introduction

May this study inspire you to cultivate a fulfilling, Godhonoring career path marked by purpose, peace, and balance.















Your Verse

Genesis 2:15 - "The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it."

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 3:23 "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters."
- Ecclesiastes 3:13 "That each of them may eat and drink, and find satisfaction in all their toil—this is the gift of God."







Devotional: Understanding Work as God's Purpose, Not a Burden

Work was part of God's original plan. Even before the fall, God placed Adam in the Garden to cultivate and care for it. This shows that work itself is not a curse but a divine assignment. Yet, work is meant to be fulfilling and connected to God's purposes, not a heavy burden or endless grind. When we recognize that our work has meaning and is a way to serve God, we can find joy and motivation beyond mere paycheck or recognition.

However, the temptation to overwork can distort this truth. We may start to believe that proving ourselves through exhaustive labor earns God's favor or others' approval, but Scripture speaks against pride and relentless striving. True satisfaction is a gift from God, not just from achieving goals. Today, reflect on how God designed work with intention and balance. How can you align your career with His purpose rather than letting it consume you?

Your Verse

Exodus 20:8-10 - "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy... six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath to the LORD your God."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 11:28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."
- Hebrews 4:9–10 "There remains, then, a Sabbath–rest for the people of God; for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their own work."







Devotional: Embracing God's Rhythm of Rest and Work

Work and rest must coexist. God commanded the Israelites to observe the Sabbath as a day of rest, underscoring its essential role in life. It's a powerful reminder that our identity is not solely tied to our productivity. Without intentional rest, our bodies, minds, and spirits wear down.

In our culture, rest is often undervalued or even seen as laziness. Yet Jesus invites us into true rest for our souls. This means more than physical relaxation; it is entrusting your work and worries to God and receiving His peace. Observing rest, whether through Sabbath or daily rhythms, prevents burnout and keeps us grounded in God's care.

How are you practicing rest? Are you willing to set boundaries so you can recharge and listen to God's voice? Remember, balance is not weakness — it's wisdom.

	Plan a concrete step to incorporate Sabbath or regular rest into your schedule.







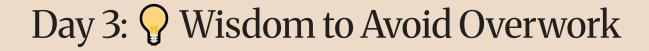
Prayer for Today

Day 3: Wisdom to Avoid Overwork

Devotional: Trusting God's Wisdom Over Relentless Work

Overwork can often stem from misplaced trust. We may believe that keeping busy, accumulating achievements, or earning more will secure our future. However, Proverbs reminds us to rely wholeheartedly on God's wisdom rather than our limited understanding. Overthinking and overstressing work may blind us from God's leading hand.

Greed and the desire for success can tempt us to sacrifice rest and relationships for career gains. Jesus warns that life is more than possessions or what we accumulate. Sleep and rest are signs of trust and contentment in God's provision. Walking wisely means asking God to guide your decisions, recognizing when to pause, delegate, or say no.

Today, invite God's wisdom to lead you away from overwork and toward a balanced, faith-filled career path.

Devotional: Renewing Your Soul to Prevent Burnout

Burnout drains not only our energy but also our soul. The psalmist paints a beautiful picture of God's care: leading us to rest and refreshing our inner being. When work pressures mount, these moments of spiritual refreshment are vital.

Recognize the signs of burnout—exhaustion, cynicism, lost joy—and don't ignore them. God's provision is not just physical but spiritual strength. Prioritize seeking God's kingdom above all, knowing that He promises to meet your needs. Incorporate habits that refresh your soul like prayer, worship, and community.

Ask yourself if your work is draining you or drawing you closer to God. Guard your heart by partnering with Him daily for renewal and strength.

Devotional: Putting God First to Find True Career Peace

Our career goals should reflect God's kingdom priorities. When we put Him first, everything else falls into place with His blessing. Anxiety about work, deadlines, or uncertainty fades as we trust God's plan.

Instead of chasing success at all costs, submit your work and ambitions to God daily. When you commit your efforts to Him, He shapes and establishes your plans, giving peace beyond understanding. Your identity then rests in being God's child, not just your job title or accomplishments.

Take time today to realign your career priorities with God's purpose for your life. Let go of stress and control, embracing trust and peace.

Devotional: Finding Joy in God-Prepared Purpose
