Your Verse

Psalm 68:5 - "A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in his holy dwelling."

Devotional: Surrender Leads to Divine Strength

Romans 8:28 reminds us that God orchestrates every detail of our lives for good, even the painful moments we don't understand. This promise is not about the absence of trials but about God's transforming presence amid them.
