Proverbs 9:10 - "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding."

Day 1: 7 The Foundation of Wisdom

Devotional: Reverence for God Lays Wisdom's Foundation

Wisdom begins with reverence for God. - Colossians 4:6 "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."
- Proverbs 15:1 "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."







Day 2: Speak with Grace and Truth

Devotional: The Balance of Truth and Grace in Mentoring

The way we communicate wisdom is as important as the wisdom itself. As mentors, it's vital to balance truth with grace — speaking honestly while nurturing and encouraging growth. Ephesians 4:15 reminds us that speaking truth in love fosters maturity and reflects Christ's heart.

Truth without love can come across as harsh or judgmental; on the other hand, grace unaccompanied by truth can lead to compromise or confusion. Our words hold power to heal, encourage, and build up, or to discourage and damage relationships.

Colossians 4:6 encourages us to season our conversations with grace and wisdom so we can respond properly to every situation. This requires sensitivity, patience, and reliance on the Holy Spirit to guide both our hearts and words.

Approach your mentoring conversations prayerfully, being mindful of your tone and intent. Wise mentors listen well before they speak and seek to build bridges, not walls.

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 18:13 "To answer before listening— that is folly and shame."
- Psalm 34:18 "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."







Devotional: Listening: The Heartbeat of Wise Mentorship

Listening is an essential, yet often overlooked, component of wise mentorship. James 1:19 challenges us to be quick to listen and slow to speak, emphasizing the importance of understanding before responding.

Mentorship isn't just about sharing wisdom but being present enough to truly hear others' struggles, joys, and questions. When we listen intently, we show respect and build trust, two key ingredients for meaningful spiritual growth.

Proverbs 18:13 warns about the folly of responding without fully hearing the other person. Wise mentors resist the urge to jump in too quickly, instead allowing space for others to express themselves openly and honestly.

Also, Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is near those who are hurting. When mentoring, be mindful that your listening can create a safe place where wounded hearts experience God's nearness through your presence.

	Write down distractions or attitudes that make listening difficult and how to overcome them.
	Commit to a prayer for God's help in becoming a better listener as a mentor.







Prayer for Today

Lord, teach me to listen well—to be present and attentive in each mentoring conversation. *Help me slow down my responses* and fully understand those I am called to guide. May my ears be tuned to Your Spirit so I can offer comfort and wisdom through simply being there.

Thank You for being close to the brokenhearted. Help me mirror Your loving presence to others.

Day 4: 🛕 Teaching by Example









Your Verse

1 Corinthians 11:1 - "Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ."

Supporting Scriptures

- Titus 2:7 "In everything set them an example by doing what is good. In your teaching show integrity, seriousness and soundness of speech that cannot be condemned."
- Matthew 5:16 "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."







Devotional: Lead with Integrity Through Your Example

Wisdom shared is best demonstrated through the witness of our lives. Paul challenges believers in 1 Corinthians 11:1 to follow his example because he follows Christ's. Similarly, as mentors, our actions often teach more than our words.

When you mentor, you become a living example of the wisdom you teach. Titus 2:7 urges us to model good behavior with integrity and seriousness, emphasizing consistency between what we say and how we live.

Jesus' call in Matthew 5:16 reminds us that our visible good works point people to God. Your lifestyle can either inspire or discourage those you mentor. This means being authentic, transparent, and humble, acknowledging your own ongoing need for God's wisdom.

Remember, mentoring is less about perfection and more about demonstrating what it looks like to follow Christ daily, learning and growing alongside others with grace.

Day 5: Wisdom in Discernment

Devotional: Discernment: Trusting God Over Understanding

Wise mentors must cultivate discernment—the ability to distinguish truth and make godly judgments. Proverbs 3:5-6 encourages us to trust God fully instead of relying on our limited understanding. Submission to God's guidance is the key to discerning right paths in mentoring decisions.

Discernment is developed over time, as Hebrews 5:14 highlights, through spiritual maturity and consistent practice. Like training muscles, daily engagement with Scripture and prayer sharpens this vital skill.

Your Verse

Philippians 2:3-4 - "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Peter 5:2-3 "Be shepherds of God's flock...not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock."
- Micah 6:8 "Act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."







Devotional: Humility and Love Define Wise Mentors

True wisdom in mentoring flows from a heart shaped by humility and love. Philippians 2:3–4 calls us to dismiss selfish ambition and instead place others' needs before our own. A wise mentor chooses humility over pride, servant leadership over control.

Peter's words in 1 Peter 5 remind us to shepherd others gently and lead by example, not with harshness or authority. Wise mentorship is relational and nurturing, reflecting Christ's servant heart.

Micah 6:8 summarizes what God desires: justice, mercy, and humility in our walk. These qualities transform mentoring relationships into spaces where truth and grace coexist beautifully.

As you conclude this study, ask God to cultivate in you the heart of a wise mentor—one who loves deeply, serves humbly, and guides faithfully.
