#### Devotional: The Reverent Start to True Wisdom

What does it truly mean to fear the Lord? In Proverbs 1:7, we learn that the fear of the Lord is the very beginning of knowledge and wisdom. But this fear isn't about terror; it's a deep reverence and recognition of God's holiness and authority over our lives. This reverent fear opens our hearts to be teachable.

When we despise wisdom and instruction—when pride blinds us—we block the doors that God has opened for growth. Being teachable means humbling ourselves enough to admit we do not have all the answers and seeking God's guidance daily.

James 1:5 reminds us that wisdom is a gift we can confidently ask for, and Psalm 111:10 confirms that following God's precepts leads to understanding. This teaches us that the first step toward wisdom is embracing a posture of humble openness to God's instruction.

Today, reflect on your own attitude: Are you open and eager to learn from God? Or do you resist correction? The door to wisdom swings on the hinges of humility. Let's choose to walk through it today.

#### Devotional: Humility Invites Lasting Wisdom

**Humility is the gateway to wisdom.** Proverbs 11:2 clearly states that pride leads to disgrace, but humility invites wisdom in. When we become teachable, we intentionally choose to lay aside our ego and embrace a posture that values God's truth above our own opinions.

Paul encourages us in *Philippians 2:3* to act with humility by considering others' needs and perspectives before our own. This mindset breaks down walls of stubbornness and opens us to learning—even from unexpected sources.

*Isaiah 66:2* shows us that God esteems a humble and contrite spirit that trembles at His word—that is, a heart sensitive to His authority and willing to obey. True growth comes not from self-confidence but from being willing to be shaped, corrected, and guided by God.

Reflect on the areas where pride may be holding you back from growth and ask God to cultivate humility in you. As you do, you'll find that wisdom begins to take root and flourish in your life.

#### Devotional: Choosing the Path of Lifelong Wisdom

Being teachable means walking through the door that leads to everincreasing wisdom. Proverbs 9:9 reveals that wise people continue to grow by accepting instruction. This is a powerful reminder that wisdom is not a destination but a lifelong journey that requires openness to correction and learning.

Often, we may resist rebuke because it feels uncomfortable or threatens our pride, but *Ecclesiastes 7:5* highlights the value of accepting wise correction over empty praise or foolish entertainment. God uses His Word, described in *2 Timothy 3:16*, as the ultimate tool to teach, rebuke, and train us.

So what does this mean for you? It's an invitation to become teachable—to eagerly listen, learn, and apply God's truth daily. When you open your heart to God's discipline and guidance, you align yourself with the way of wisdom and growth. The path may not always be easy, but it leads to a life marked by divine understanding and peace.

Today, choose to embrace a teachable spirit and allow God's truth to transform you from the inside out.
