Matthew 5:13 - "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again?"

Supporting Scriptures

- Colossians 4:6 "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt."
- Mark 9:50 "Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can you make it salty again?"







Devotional: Embrace Your Role as Salt

Jesus calls you the salt of the earth. That means you carry a special purpose — to add flavor and preserve goodness around you, especially in your friend group. Salt isn't just about taste; it stops things from spoiling and keeps them fresh. When you're with your friends, you have the chance to stop harmful attitudes like gossip, negativity, or peer pressure from taking over. Your words and actions can bring life and positivity.

But salt that loses its saltiness isn't useful anymore. Jesus warns us that if we don't live intentionally, if we let the culture around us numb our influence, we lose the power God gave us to make a difference. Think about your friendships—how can you bring the flavor of kindness, truth, and encouragement?

Being salt means standing strong in God's truth, even when it's not popular. It means offering grace and speaking words that build up rather than tear down. You don't have to be loud or perfect—just real and filled with God's love. Today, ask God to show you how to be salt in your conversations and choices.

Your Verse

Supporting Scriptures

- Philippians 2:15 "...so that you may become blameless and pure, 'children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.' Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky."
- John 8:12 "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness."







Day 2:
Shine Your Light Brightly

Devotional: Let Your Light Shine Boldly

Imagine a city on a hill glowing brightly in the dark. That's how Jesus describes us — His followers — as light in the world. Light helps people see clearly and find their way. When you let God's light shine through you, your friend group experiences hope, joy, and direction.

Sometimes it's tempting to hide who we really are or dim our faith to fit in. But Jesus encourages us to be visible, confident, and bold. Your actions and choices reflect your heart and impact those around you. When you choose to be honest, kind, and faithful, you shine light into situations that might otherwise feel dark or confusing to your friends.

Being light also means showing God's love through practical ways — standing up for someone being treated unfairly, including those left out, or encouraging a friend who's struggling. Your authentic light can inspire others to seek Jesus and live differently too.

Ask God today to help you shine brightly in your friend group. Pray for opportunities to share His light in tangible ways.

Day 3: Through Grace

Devotional: Speak Words Filled with Grace

Your words have power. To be salt and light in your friend group means your conversations can encourage, uplift, and bring peace. Paul reminds believers to let their talk be full of grace — kind, gentle, and thoughtful — seasoned as salt adds flavor. Instead of hurting or tearing down, your speech can build others up.

It's not always easy. Sometimes it's tempting to join in when friends gossip, make fun of someone, or spread negativity. But you can choose differently. By speaking with love and wisdom, you influence your friends more than you might realize. Setting a good example shows strength and maturity.

Think about the last time you spoke to a friend who was struggling or felt left out. How did your words impact them? Grace-filled speech softens hearts and opens doors for God's truth. It also reflects Jesus' character.

Today, ask God to help you speak with grace and use your words intentionally to nurture your friendships and share love.

Supporting Scriptures

- John 17:17 "Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth."
- Psalm 119:105 "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."







Devotional: Stand Strong on God's Truth

Being salt and light means standing on God's truth. In your friend group, you may encounter peer pressure to conform, ignore what's right, or stay silent when something is wrong. God wants you to stand firm with the "belt of truth" — holding tightly to His Word that guides your choices and beliefs.

Truth isn't always easy, especially when it conflicts with popular opinions. But God's truth brings freedom and clarity. It protects you from making decisions that harm your walk with Him or hurt others. When you live by His Word, you shine as a trustworthy and reliable friend.

Your commitment to truth can inspire others to question harmful attitudes or choices they've accepted. While you won't have all the answers, your integrity makes God's presence visible.

Today, spend time reading Scripture and asking God to strengthen your resolve. Pray for boldness to live truth in your daily interactions.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 John 3:18 "Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth."
- Galatians 5:14 "The entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'"







Devotional: Love Others Through Your Actions

Love is more than what we say — **it's what we do.** Jesus commands us to love one another as He loved us. In your friend group, this love is shown through actions — reaching out to someone who's lonely, forgiving quickly, including those who feel left out, or serving without expecting anything in return.

Love is powerful salt and light. It preserves relationships and brightens hearts. Sometimes loving others means making sacrifices or showing patience when it's hard. But the result is strong friendships and a witness that others notice.

Consider the ways you can demonstrate God's love tangibly this week. Small acts of kindness often have big impact, reminding friends they matter and are cherished by God.

Ask God to fill your heart with His love and reveal opportunities to serve and care.

- 1 Peter 5:6 "Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand..."







Day 6: **B** Grow in Humility

Devotional: Let Humility Guide Your Influence

Humility keeps your salt fresh and your light shining. It means putting others first, being willing to listen, and admitting when you're wrong. This attitude makes you approachable and trustworthy in your friend group.

Sometimes it's tempting to seek attention or prove yourself, especially as a teen. But true influence comes when you serve with a humble heart. Jesus modeled this perfectly, washing His disciples' feet and choosing the path of sacrifice.

Humility helps you respond with patience when friendships get difficult and keeps pride from blocking your impact. It also opens your heart to learn and grow in God's ways.

Today, reflect on areas where you can grow in humility. Ask God to soften your heart and help you value others deeply.

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 51:10 "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me."







Devotional: Commit Again to Shine Brightly
