Devotional: Understanding Your Spiritual Authority as Father

Spiritual authority is foundational to biblical fatherhood, especially in adoption. You may wonder how to exercise authority over children who do not share your DNA, but Scripture shows that authority is given by God, not by biology. *God calls all fathers to lovingly nurture and disciple their children.*

Ephesians 6:4 commands fathers not to provoke anger but to raise children with training rooted in the Lord's instruction. This shows authority used correctly is patient, protective, and purposeful. It guards the heart and shapes character without causing resentment.

As an adoptive father, you represent God's authority and love in a tangible way. Your role is to lead with humility and strength, knowing God disciplines those He loves for their good and growth (Hebrews 12:7). Day 2: V The Power of Unconditional Love

Devotional: Choosing to Love Unconditionally Every Day

Loving children you didn't biologically create requires a deliberate choice to reflect God's unconditional love. 1 Corinthians 13 beautifully describes this love: patient, kind, humble, and enduring. Adoptive fatherhood especially demands this because children may come with wounds or questions about identity.

Your love becomes a healing balm as you imitate Christ's perfect love. Romans reminds us that God's love is unshakeable and unbreakable — and as His sons, we are called to make that love visible in our homes.

Unconditional love means accepting your children fully, with their past, their hearts, and their hopes. It means setting aside pride, impatience, or prejudice, and embracing them with open arms and patient hearts. Love is not always easy; it often takes time to build trust and security, but your consistent love speaks louder than words ever could.

Jesus commands us to love others as He loves us, holding nothing back. Embracing this command in adoptive fatherhood sets a foundation for connection, belonging, and spiritual growth that will transform both your children and you.

Devotional: Balancing Strength and Tenderness as Protector

Being a father after adoption means standing in as protector, defender, and safe haven. God calls Himself a father to the fatherless (Psalm 68:5), setting a profound example for us to follow.

Your role is to create an environment where your children feel secure—emotionally, spiritually, and physically. This requires a balance of strength and tenderness, standing firm against anything that might harm or dishonor your family, while also extending grace and comfort.

Isaiah promises that children taught by the Lord will experience great peace. As you guard your heart and theirs (Proverbs 4:23), you safeguard the spiritual atmosphere of your home. Your defense is not only against physical dangers but also negative influences and emotional wounds.

Protecting your children means being attentive to their needs and vulnerabilities, listening deeply, and engaging in their world with empathy. Walking this path shows them they are valued and safe, encouraging spiritual growth and deepened trust.

Devotional: Commit to Leadership Rooted in Scripture

Leadership grounded in God's Word is the cornerstone of godly fatherhood. Joshua's declaration (24:15) sets a powerful example of a man who consciously chooses to lead his household in serving the Lord.

As an adoptive father, intentional leadership in spiritual matters brings clarity, direction, and unity to families that may have experienced disruption or uncertainty. God's Word lights the way (Psalm 119:105), providing guidance, wisdom, and hope.

The commands of Deuteronomy urge fathers to integrate God's truths into daily life and conversations. This daily teaching strengthens your children's faith and identity and establishes a spiritual legacy.

Devotional: The Gift of Fatherly Presence

Your presence as a father is a profound gift that builds trust and security. Psalm 127 reminds us that children are gifts from God, and as their father, your attentive presence honors that gift.

Especially in adoption, where children may question belonging and love, your consistent, loving availability speaks volumes. Jesus' welcome of children (Mark 10:14) shows their worth to God and the importance of making space for their hearts.

Proverbs encourages us not to withhold good when it is in our power to act, which applies powerfully to shared time, attention, and affection. Presence is a ministry—a way you show love and affirm identity.

Be intentional about moments together, listening deeply, engaging in activities, and expressing interest. These ongoing investments nurture trust, helping your children feel deeply valued and secure in your leadership and love.

Legacy includes not only words but your lived example. Endeavor to create a family environment rich in faith, story, and truth—a lasting witness of God's unfailing love and power. Your role is a vital link in God's eternal plan.

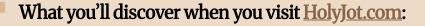




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
