In this 21-day study, we will delve into each major feast, examining its original significance and unveiling the fulfillment found in Christ. The Feast of Passover commemorates God's mighty deliverance of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. The death angel 'passed over' homes marked with the blood of a lamb, sparing them from judgment.

This feast carries profound significance, as it foreshadows Jesus Christ—the ultimate Passover Lamb. Just as the blood on the doorposts brought protection and salvation to the Israelites, Jesus' blood brings forgiveness and eternal life to all who trust Him.

In 1 Corinthians 5:7, Paul makes this connection explicit, reminding us that Christ's sacrifice fulfills the Passover's meaning.

Reflect on the cost of our freedom and the incredible love God demonstrated. Jesus' death was not accidental but ordained as the perfect fulfillment of the Passover Lamb's role.

The Feast of Pentecost, also known as the Festival of Weeks, celebrates the firstfruits of the wheat harvest and the giving of the Law at Mount Sinai.

This feast holds a deeper New Testament fulfillment in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the early church. On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon Jesus' disciples, empowering them to boldly proclaim the gospel.

Acts 2 reveals how this moment launched the church's mission and fulfilled God's promise of a Helper.

As we study Pentecost, reflect on the new life and empowerment believers receive through the Holy Spirit—connecting the Old Testament harvest celebration to spiritual harvest that continues today.

The Feast of Trumpets signals the start of the seventh month with solemn trumpet blasts, calling God's people to gather and prepare.

This feast prophetically points toward the future return of Jesus Christ, marked by trumpet blasts signaling His coming in glory. The New Testament echoes these imagery in passages like 1 Thessalonians 4, where the Lord's return is announced with trumpet sound.

While the Israelites awaited the physical sounding of trumpets, we now live with the hope and anticipation of Christ's triumphant return.

Reflect on the call to live expectantly, being spiritually prepared for the day Jesus will come again.

His blood not only spared physical death but brings eternal forgiveness and reconciliation with God.

Consider the profound love expressed through this sacrifice and the freedom we receive by His blood.
