Devotional: Wisdom Begins with Reverence for God

Wisdom begins with reverence for God. When navigating fame and influence, it can be tempting to rely on our own understanding or seek advice from worldly sources. But Scripture makes it clear that true wisdom starts with a healthy fear of the Lord—a deep respect and awe for His holiness and authority.

This foundational attitude aligns our hearts with God's perspective, not just our personal ambitions or public image. King Solomon, known for his legendary wisdom, prayed to God for understanding, emphasizing that wisdom is a _gift_ rather than something earned solely by education or experience.

Ask God daily for wisdom as you steward your platform. Recognize that He is the ultimate source of insight, and your influence will bear fruit when you submit to His guidance. Without this foundation, even the most public success can become shallow, fleeting, or distorted by pride.

Approach your influence as a sacred opportunity to glorify God by reflecting His values to those who watch you.

Devotional: Protect Your Heart to Preserve Integrity

Your heart is the source of your influence. It shapes your motives, your words, and how you respond to the applause or criticism that comes with fame. Proverbs 4:23 urges us to guard our hearts diligently because what flows from it influences everything—our character, decisions, and relationships.

If you do not protect your heart, the temptations of pride, selfishness, or greed can easily take root. The world's approval is fleeting, and without a heart firmly grounded in God's truth, it's easy to lose your way.

Jesus reminded us where our treasure is, our heart will follow. What you value most will uniquely direct your influence and the legacy you leave. Because human hearts are naturally prone to deception, continual self-examination and surrender to God are essential.

Daily ask God to guard your heart, to reveal hidden motives, and to keep you humble. Let Him preserve your heart so that your actions honor Him and serve others well.

Day 3: **B** Humility in Influence

Devotional: Embrace Humility as Your True Strength

Humility is countercultural but essential when wielding influence. It protects you from the pitfalls of pride and self-centered ambition. The Apostle Paul encourages believers to value others above themselves and to avoid vain conceit—a tendency very common for those in the public eye.

True leadership and influence reflect Christ's example, who, despite all authority, chose humility and servant leadership rather than seeking personal glory. Scripture teaches that God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble, reminding us that humility invites God's favor rather than human praise.

Living humbly doesn't mean denying your giftedness; rather, it means recognizing that your platform and talents are gifts from God for the good of others. Let your influence be marked by justice, mercy, and humble obedience to God's will.

Devotional: Speak to Build Up and Encourage

Being famous or influential can bring pressure to speak loudly or controversially. Yet, wisdom calls for restraint, grace, and discernment. Proverbs highlights the power of gentle words to defuse tension, while harshness can provoke conflict.

Wise speech honors God and serves His people. Colossians encourages seasoning your speech with grace—meaning kindness, truth, and love infused with the Holy Spirit's guidance. This keeps your influence positive and effective.

Ask God to shape your words today. Use your platform to uplift, encourage, and share truth with love and humility.

Devotional: Lead by Serving with Humility

True leadership in influence is rooted in service. Jesus redefined greatness by showing that those who lead must be willing to serve others selflessly. As an influencer, your platform is not a throne but a tool to bless and uplift the community.

Mark reminds us that even Christ did not seek to be served but to serve sacrificially. When you adopt this servant leadership model, your fame becomes a conduit for God's love, kindness, and justice.

Peter encourages leaders to care genuinely for those they influence without domineering or abusing their position. Galatians calls us to serve humbly in love—putting others' needs above personal ambition.

Ask God to show you how to serve your audience with Christlike love, recognizing your influence is a stewardship to be handled with humility and compassion.

Devotional: Choose Patience Over Prideful Impulses

Patience is a vital virtue for those with influence. The pressures of immediate results, public scrutiny, or setbacks can tempt you toward frustration or prideful reactions. Ecclesiastes reminds us that patient endurance and humility produce better outcomes than hasty pride.
