Day 2:

The Root of Greed

Devotional: Guarding the Heart Against Greed's Roots

Mark 7:21–22 reveals that greed is not merely external behavior but a symptom of inner unrest and brokenness. The heart is the battlefield.

Devotional: Learning to Trust God Over Wealth

Psalm 62:10 speaks directly against setting our hearts on riches, reminding us that material gain is fleeting. Jesus' teaching in *Matthew 6:24* clarifies that divided loyalty between money and God is impossible.

Consider today where your trust lies. Are you tempted to see money as a source of ultimate security or identity? What happened in your life when money held too much power over your heart?

True security and lasting treasure are found only in God. The journey of breaking greed takes us back to trusting God alone.

Philippians 4 shows that contentment is learned and empowered by Christ's strength, enabling us to endure hardship or abundance without craving more.

Godly contentment leads to great gain—spiritual riches that money cannot buy. When we keep our lives free from the love of money and embrace what we have, our hearts are freed to worship God fully.

Reflect today on the areas where you struggle to be content. What would it mean to trust God's provision and rest in His sufficiency?

The good news in our fight against greed is that Christ offers true freedom. Our old self—dominated by sin's power including greed—was nailed to the cross with Jesus.

Romans 6:6 shows that through Jesus, we can shed the chains of sinful desires and live empowered by the Spirit. Paul urges the Galatians not to return to slavery but to stand firm in the freedom Christ gives.

True freedom means not being enslaved to money, possessions, or greed. Jesus declares that those He frees are free indeed.

Today, believe that freedom is possible. Identify any areas where greed still dominates your life and invite Jesus to break those chains.

Growth comes with choosing freedom in Christ daily.

Devotional: Prioritizing Eternal over Earthly Wealth

Matthew 6:19–21 challenges our priorities by linking our heart's location with our treasure's location.

Today, evaluate the influences around you: are they pulling you toward materialism? How can you nurture a transformed mind that sees life through God's eternal perspective?

Protect your heart by daily renewing it through Scripture and prayer.
