Today, start practicing this mindset renewal by memorizing or meditating on passages that affirm your identity in Christ and His desire for your purity.

Devotional: Breaking the Stronghold of Sin's Cycle

Addiction often feels like a never-ending cycle—temptation, guilt, shame, and back again. Proverbs 5:22 paints a vivid picture of how sin's cords can bind us when we don't break free.

Understanding this cycle is empowering because it exposes the enemy's strategy. Shame and guilt can be heavy burdens, as David describes in Psalm 38:4, but they don't have to define us.

Recognizing when you're trapped in this loop enables you to take intentional steps—such as confession, accountability, and seeking God's mercy—to interrupt it.

God's grace is greater than your past or present struggles. He desires to loosen those cords and replace them with peace and strength.

The Spirit empowers, guides, and strengthens you even when your natural tendencies pull you toward temptation. Romans 8:13 further assures that the Spirit enables you to put to death sinful deeds through renewal.

Additionally, Ephesians 6:10 encourages you to find strength in God's mighty power rather than your own. *This strength empowers you to overcome urges and pursue holiness.*
