Every family has a unique God-ordained identity and purpose. The Psalms affirm that God places the lonely in families, providing belonging and purpose. Through Christ, families become part of God's larger family with eternal significance.

Your family altar can celebrate and embrace your identity both as a biological family and a spiritual household. Recognize each person's role and contribution. Celebrate traditions, milestones, and God's faithfulness.

Knowing your family identity fosters security and a sense of mission. It motivates stewardship of relationships and legacy-building.
