#### Devotional: God's Design for Unity in Diversity

# Devotional: Passing on Wisdom with Honor and Respect

#### Devotional: Empowering Youth as Vital Church Members

#### Devotional: Cultivating Love and Honor Across Generations

# Devotional: Passing God's Truth from Generation to Generation

# Devotional: Honoring the Past While Embracing the New
