Devotional: Balancing Honesty with Grace

Paul encourages believers to speak the truth in love as part of maturing in Christ. This means being honest while remaining compassionate and respectful. For relationships with non-Christians, this approach can open doors for meaningful dialogue instead of arguments. When conversations are laced with grace and seasoned with sensitivity, hearts soften and barriers crumble.

Consider your communication style: do you speak with kindness and clarity? Are you ready to listen as much as you speak? Practice expressing your faith truthfully but gently, inviting curiosity rather than alienation.

Devotional: Walking Wisely in Relationship

Day 5: Peing a Light in Darkness
