# Devotional: Trusting God Creates Trust Between Spouses

#### Devotional: Speak Words That Build Up Your Spouse

Words have the power to build or break down. In marriage, communication is more than exchanging information—it's a bridge that fosters emotional safety. Ephesians 4:29 teaches us to speak only what builds up and meets each other's needs.

Compassionate communication is rooted in listening first, understanding without judgment, and responding with kindness. James 1:19 emphasizes being quick to listen and slow to anger, reminding us how important patience and empathy are for a safe emotional space.

Consider how your words either create an environment of comfort or cause walls to go up. Are there times when impatience or harsh speech has hindered emotional safety? God invites us to choose words that heal and nurture, reflecting His love through our communication.

#### Devotional: Forgiveness Heals and Strengthens Marriage

**Forgiveness is central to emotional safety.** Hurt and mistakes happen in every marriage, but how we respond shapes the health of the relationship. Colossians 3:13 calls us to bear with one another and to forgive as Christ has forgiven us.

Forgiveness isn't just an action; it's a decision to release resentment and choose love. It creates space for healing, restores trust, and builds spiritual peace within the home. Ephesians 4:32 reminds us to be kind and compassionate as we let go of offenses.

Reflect on how forgiving your spouse strengthens your emotional bond. Holding onto bitterness harms both partners. When we forgive, we mirror Christ's grace and open the door for deeper intimacy and safety.

#### Devotional: Love's Patience and Kindness Build Safety

Patience and kindness are essential fruits of love that nurture emotional safety. 1 Corinthians 13:4 beautifully describes love as patient and kind, qualities that ease tension and build trust between spouses.

The fruit of the Spirit, listed in Galatians 5:22, invites believers to actively cultivate these virtues as daily habits. Ephesians 4:2 encourages us to be humble, gentle, and patient, bearing with one another in love even when it's difficult.

Growing in patience and kindness means choosing grace over frustration and gentleness over harshness. When couples cultivate these qualities, their homes become refuges of comfort and emotional security.

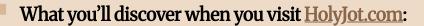
