Ask yourself: Do potential leaders desire to serve God's people genuinely? Are they blameless in their conduct inside and outside the church? Remember, God's leadership culture begins with God-honoring men who lead by example and rely on Him daily.

Ask the Lord to reveal potential leaders who may currently be unseen or overlooked. Sometimes God calls men who are humble and willing to serve behind the scenes before stepping into higher leadership. *Our role is to watch closely, pray fervently, and guide wisely.*

Remember, leadership is about stewardship of people and vision, not status. Be intentional in identifying men who demonstrate both faith and fruit in their daily walk.
