A 7-day plan guiding teens to develop a personal, authentic faith beyond their parents' beliefs.





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Introduction

Devotional: Take Ownership of Your Faith Journey

Starting your faith journey means making a personal choice to trust God.

Proverbs reminds us not to rely only on what we think or what others tell us but to lean on the Lord wholeheartedly. This can feel scary because it means stepping away from the familiar, including the faith your parents have taught you. But God promises to guide every step you take when you choose to trust Him.

God's plan for your life is filled with hope and purpose — *not just a copy of anyone else's story.* He patiently wants to teach you, counsel you, and direct you personally. This day is about saying, "God, I want to know You for myself, not just because this is how I was raised." When you make that decision, you'll start to see your path grow clearer, even if it's different from others around you.

Take courage and choose to build a faith that's yours.

Devotional: Build an Intimate Friendship with God

Faith grows when you know God not just as a distant figure but as a friend. Jesus said that His followers are friends, meaning He wants close, honest, and intimate relationship with you. This means inviting God into your daily life — your joys, struggles, questions, and dreams.

Knowing God personally means more than agreeing with what others say about Him. You get to experience His goodness firsthand—like tasting a delicious meal or feeling the warmth of a trusted friend. Don't be afraid to ask questions or express doubts. When you draw near to God, He promises to draw near to you in love and truth.

This day encourage you to start a conversation with God that is your own. Share your heart, listen in silence, and look for His work in your life. Knowing God personally is the foundation of a faith that belongs to you.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Thessalonians 5:21 "Test everything; hold on to what is good."







Day 3: V Handling Doubts and Questions

Devotional: Embrace Questions as Part of Faith

Doubt is a natural part of growing a real faith. The father in Mark's story openly admitted his mixed feelings—believing but also struggling. This honesty shows that God welcomes our questions and fears, not hides from them.

Your faith will be stronger when you face doubts head-on, not push them aside. God can handle your honest feelings because He is the source of strength and truth. The Bible encourages you to test what you hear, think, and study—holding on to what is good while discarding confusion.

Don't be ashamed to ask tough questions or admit uncertainty. Use these moments to seek deeper understanding and grow your relationship with God in a way that is truly yours.

- Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is alive and active..."







Day 4: 7 Growing Through the Word

Devotional: Let God's Word Shape Your Faith

The Bible is your foundation for building a strong, personal faith. It is God's inspired message to teach you how to live and grow closer to Him. Unlike just following rules, reading Scripture equips you to understand God's heart and apply His wisdom to your unique life.

When you read the Bible, it lights up your path and shapes your character. It has the power to change your life because it is alive—speaking directly to your thoughts, feelings, and circumstances. This growth process happens best when you study regularly, not only to gain knowledge but to hear God's voice personally.

Commit to reading and reflecting on Scripture daily. Let the Word shape your own faith story, distinct from anyone else's, as God reveals Himself uniquely to you.

Day 6: 6 Living Out Your Faith Boldly

Devotional: Be Courageous in Sharing Your Faith

Devotional: Commit to Your Unique Walk with God

Today is a reminder to fully own your faith journey. Embrace it with hope, obedience, and joy, knowing God's grace goes with you every step of the way.





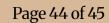


Reflect and Apply
