#### Devotional: Invite Others With Gentleness and Respect

Inviting others to church isn't just what we say, but how we say it. 1 Peter directs us to be ready to explain our hope in Christ, but to do so with gentleness and respect. This balance is crucial in a career setting where relationships and reputations matter. A harsh approach can close doors, while a gentle word can open hearts.

Our words have the power to build up or tear down. Ephesians reminds us to speak in ways that uplift others. Proverbs highlights that a gentle response defuses tension. When we invite colleagues or clients to church, our tone, patience, and kindness can be just as persuasive as the message itself.

#### Devotional: Discern the Right Time to Share

Galatians encourages perseverance. Even if your first invitation doesn't lead to immediate fruit, continue to do good, sow seeds of kindness, and trust that God will bring the harvest in His time. Patience with timing leads to deeper impact and stronger connections.

Trust God with the outcomes of your invitations. Keep sowing seeds with love, wisdom, and prayer, and watch how He brings about a beautiful harvest in His perfect time.
