Introduction

Welcome to this 7-day Bible study on 1 Thessalonians 4, where we will be diving deep into one of the most profound and hopeful passages in Scripture concerning the Rapture—the event that promises that *the dead in Christ will rise first*.

In 1 Thessalonians 4:13–18, the Apostle Paul writes to encourage believers who were concerned about their loved ones who had died before Christ's return. This passage assures us with clarity and hope, painting a picture of reunion, resurrection, and eternal fellowship with the Lord.

1 Thessalonians 4:13–14 NIV – "Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death..."

- 1 Corinthians 15:51–52 "We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed..."







Devotional: The Foundation of Our Blessed Hope

Paul's words to the Thessalonian believers address a question that is still relevant today: What happens to those who have died before Christ returns? They were concerned, uncertain, and grieving. Paul gently reassures them not to grieve like those without hope because, in Christ, death is not the end.

The phrase "those who sleep in death" is a biblical metaphor that speaks to the temporary nature of physical death for believers. Jesus' promise in John 14 that He is preparing a place for us reassures us that heaven is our eternal home. Paul's teaching assures believers both alive and gone that all will be reunited in Christ.

This passage establishes the sure foundation for Christian hope: the Rapture is not a scary event but a joyous reunion. We can live with confidence knowing the Lord has overcome death and will bring us to be with Him forever.

Day 2: 🎇 The Order of Resurrection Revealed

Devotional: The Sequence of God's Glorious Plan

Paul lays out the order in which events will unfold at Christ's return. First, there is the resurrection of believers who died, then those alive at His coming will be caught up together with them. This sequence clarifies confusion and offers hope to all Christians regardless of whether they are alive or have passed on.

Being "caught up" or "raptured" speaks to a sudden, miraculous removal to meet Christ in the air. This is not just a spiritual metaphor but a real event that changes the state of believers, transforming physical bodies to be immortal and glorious as described in Scripture.

The unity of God's people at this moment foreshadows the eternal fellowship we will share with Christ and one another. It is a breathtaking perspective that encourages faithfulness and readiness.

Devotional: Encouragement Rooted in Eternal Love

Paul concludes this section urging believers to **encourage one another with the hope of the resurrection and reunion**. The promise of the Rapture is not just a future event but a continuing source of comfort amid trials, loss, and uncertainty.

Knowing that God will bring His people together forever offers peace that surpasses circumstances. It encourages us to support one another in community, reminding each other constantly of the great love that binds us.

In a world of grief and separation, this passage grounds us in a love that cannot be undone. It invites us also to be agents of comfort and hope to those around us.

While the Rapture is a future hope, Paul emphasizes that believers are called to live differently here and now. Holiness and sanctification are the lifestyle responses to the hope we possess.

Living in readiness means embracing purity, self-control, and a transformation marked by God's Spirit. It reflects a life set apart from worldly influences in joyful anticipation of Christ's coming.

This call urges us to examine our daily choices, to reject sin's enticement, and to embody Kingdom values while anticipating the glorious future God has prepared. It honors the hope we claim and prepares us spiritually and practically for the day when we will stand before Him.

When our eyes are fixed on Jesus, we align our priorities with His kingdom agenda, living in a way that honors our future and impacts our present positively.
