Day 1: 💮 The Value God Places on Children

Devotional: Welcoming Children into God's Kingdom

Devotional: Guided and Empowered by the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is God's gift to all believers, including children. Jesus promised the Spirit would teach and remind us of His words, providing guidance no matter our age. When children receive the Holy Spirit, they become active participants in God's family, able to understand and live out His truths in ways beyond human wisdom.

The Spirit does not discriminate; His love and power flow freely to the young and old alike. In Acts, we learn that sons and daughters alike will prophesy—meaning they will speak forth God's message—demonstrating leadership and faith. This shows how the Spirit equips children to contribute meaningfully in God's kingdom.

Take time today to reflect on the Holy Spirit's presence in your life and in the lives of children you know. How can you support them in recognizing and relying on this divine presence?

Devotional: The Father's Compassion and Care for Children

The Father's love for children is abundant and personal. As 1 John 3:1 reminds us, God lavishes His love upon us and calls us His children. This identity is a gift, an invitation into a lasting relationship marked by care, provision, and compassion.

God's fatherly role includes nurturing and providing for our needs—physical, emotional, and spiritual. He watches over us like a tender parent watches a child, attentive and protective. His compassion is reflected in the little things, even in how He cares for birds and plants. By understanding the Father's heart, children can feel secure and cherished in His family.

Day 4: 1 Jesus, Our Savior and Friend

Devotional: Jesus Welcomes and Befriends Children
