Day 1: Identifying Modern Idols

Devotional: Recognizing What Steals Your Heart

Modern idols may look different from the golden statues described in the Old Testament, but they still have a powerful hold over our hearts. Consider your phone, social media, the desire for popularity, or money. These can become the "gods" you put before God without realizing it.

Exodus 20:3 reminds us plainly, "You shall have no other gods before me." When we elevate anything above God, we risk losing sight of His perfect love and guidance. Matthew 6:24 highlights that we can't serve both God and money (or anything else) at the same time.

Take a moment to honestly assess what often commands your thoughts and time. What do you turn to for comfort or confidence? Becoming aware of these modern idols is the first step in taking back your heart and placing God first.

Devotional: Choosing God's Approval Over People's

Popularity and approval can feel like the ultimate prize for teens. We often seek acceptance in groups, on social media platforms, or from influential people. Yet, when our desire for human approval becomes an idol, it can lead us away from living authentically and following God's path.

In Galatians 1:10, Paul asks, "Am I now trying to win the approval of human beings, or of God?" This challenges us to consider whose approval truly matters. Proverbs 29:25 warns that fearing people can trap us, while trusting in God brings security.

The desire to be liked can cause us to compromise values or hide our true selves. Jesus experienced this when some loved praise from people more than from God (John 12:43). Today, reflect on how your quest for approval might be a modern idol.

3.	How can trusting God more change the way you view yourself and others?







Journaling Prompts

Describe a situation where you chose people's approval over God's approval.
Write about how it feels when you are accepted by others versus when you follow God's truth.
List ways to remind yourself daily that God's opinion is the most important.







Prayer for Today

Father, forgive me when I seek the approval of others ahead of You. Help me to find my worth and identity in Your love alone. *Give me strength to stand firm in my faith, even when it's unpopular.* Teach me to trust Your perfect acceptance above all else. Thank You for being the One who truly sees and values me. **Amen.**

1 Timothy 6:10 – "For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil."

Supporting Scriptures

- Hebrews 13:5 "Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have."
- Luke 12:15 "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed."







Day 3: 5 Putting God Before Possessions

Devotional: Finding Contentment in God Alone

Money and possessions can easily become idols when we depend on them for security and happiness. As a teen, you might dream about having the latest gadgets, fashion, or status symbols. These desires aren't wrong in themselves, but they can become dangerous if they start to rule your heart.

1 Timothy 6:10 warns us that loving money is a root of all kinds of evil. The Bible encourages contentment (Hebrews 13:5) and cautions us to be on guard against greed (Luke 12:15).

True satisfaction comes not from what we own but from who we belong to—God. By placing God before possessions, we find peace and purpose that no amount of money can provide. Reflect on what brings you joy today and whether it points you toward or away from God.
