Devotional: Joy Grows When We Follow the Spirit

What does it mean that joy is a fruit of the Spirit? In Galatians 5:22, Paul teaches that when we live in step with the Holy Spirit, our lives begin to show qualities like love and joy naturally. This joy is not based on external things but is a deep inner gladness created by God's Spirit dwelling inside us.

Often, teens feel like joy is just a response to fun or success. But God wants to give us a joy that remains even when challenges come. Nehemiah 8:10 reminds us that "the joy of the Lord is your strength." Imagine drawing your strength from a joy God freely gives — a power that helps you keep going.

Today, consider how your relationship with God impacts your happiness. Are you trying to find joy only in things around you, or are you inviting the Holy Spirit to fill you with a deeper joy? Spending time in God's presence, as Psalm 16:11 says, fills us with a lasting joy because we walk the path He has set for us.

Choosing joy is a daily opportunity to rely not on fleeting feelings or circumstances but on God's Spirit within.

Devotional: Finding Joy Like Jesus Through Trials

How did Jesus experience joy? Hebrews 12:2 reveals an amazing truth: Jesus endured unimaginable suffering because He was looking forward to the joy God had prepared. His joy was not based on earthly pleasures but on the eternal hope and purpose of His mission.

This teaches us that joy and trials coexist. James encourages us to "consider it pure joy whenever you face trials," knowing that these challenges develop perseverance and maturity in our faith.

Jesus wants His joy to be in us, and for our joy to be complete. That means choosing to trust and stay close to Him even when life is hard. His joy is a gift that can sustain us through pain, disappointment, or fear.

Think about what it means to keep your eyes on Jesus, remembering His joy as motivation and strength to face your own struggles as a teen.

Devotional: Make Joy Your Daily Decision with God

Joy is a choice we make each day. Paul's encouragement to "Rejoice in the Lord always" reminds us that joy is not dependent on circumstances but on a conscious decision to celebrate God's goodness every day.

Psalm 118:24 invites us to see each day as a gift from God worthy of gladness. When we focus on gratitude, prayer, and praise—even in hard times—we nurture a joyful heart.

This means choosing joy is an ongoing practice. As a teen, daily challenges can tempt you toward discouragement or sadness, but God calls you to a discipline of rejoicing, praying constantly, and being thankful no matter what.

Let today be the day you start to intentionally seek joy through a thankful heart and a close connection with God.
