Devotional: Building Dating on Godly Love

Understanding what true love looks like is the very foundation for healthy dating boundaries. The world often portrays love as fleeting or self-centered, but Scripture paints a truer picture—love that is patient, kind, and humble. When teens build relationships rooted in this kind of love, they can develop deep respect and care rather than impulsive attraction.

1 Corinthians 13 helps us see the qualities of godly love: patience in times of disagreement, kindness even when things are hard, and humility that puts others first. Devotional: Healthy Communication Builds Respect

Day 4: We Respecting Yourself and Others

Devotional: Honoring God's Image in Dating

Devotional: Inviting God Into Your Relationship

Dating with godly boundaries means inviting God into your relationship from the very beginning. Couples who seek His guidance together build their relationships on a foundation of wisdom, trust, and shared spiritual values.

James 1:5 encourages us to seek God's wisdom freely and fearlessly. When you face questions about boundaries or relationship decisions, pray together and ask God to lead you. This builds unity and aligns your hearts with His will.

Devotional: Choosing Purity Through God's Strength

Purity and self-control are essential components of dating boundaries that honor God. In a culture that often pressures teens to rush into physical intimacy, Scripture calls us to a higher standard—one of sanctification and respect.

1 Thessalonians 4:3 clearly states God's will for us to avoid sexual immorality. This requires intentional choices and self-discipline, which is empowered by the Holy Spirit's fruit, including self-control (Galatians 5:22–23).

Maintaining purity is not only about external actions but also about cultivating a pure heart, as Jesus teaches in Matthew 5:8. When your heart focuses on honoring God, your decisions around physical boundaries become easier to uphold even when tempted.

Rely on God daily to strengthen your willpower and fill you with peace and joy as you choose to wait and respect your body and others'. These choices bring blessings now and in future relationships.
