Your Verse

Ephesians 6:12 - "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

Devotional: Awareness: The First Step in Spiritual Warfare

Your Verse

Matthew 6:14-15 - "For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins."

Supporting Scriptures

- Ephesians 4:31–32 "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
- Colossians 3:13 "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you."







Devotional: Forgiveness: The Weapon That Closes Doors

Unforgiveness is a common spiritual gateway. When we hold grudges or refuse to forgive, we give the enemy a foothold in our hearts. This bitterness festers and opens the door to attacks on our peace, mental health, and relationships.

Jesus makes it clear that forgiveness is not optional; it is essential for receiving God's forgiveness. It's a powerful weapon to close open doors because it breaks the enemy's hold over past wounds and offenses.

Take time today to ask God to reveal any unforgiveness you are harboring. Pray for strength to forgive as Christ forgives you—fully and freely. Remember, forgiving doesn't mean excusing wrong but releasing the right to retaliate. When you forgive, you shut the door on bitterness and invite God's healing and peace to flood your spirit.

Journaling Prompts

1.	Write a letter (not necessarily to send) to someone you need to forgive.

3.	List the benefits you expect to experience as you choose to forgive.







Prayer for Today

Father, help me to forgive those who have hurt me, just as You have forgiven me. Remove every trace of bitterness from my heart and replace it with Your peace and love. I choose to close this door to the enemy's attacks. Thank You for Your grace that makes this possible. *In Jesus' Name, Amen.*















Your Verse

1 John 1:9 – "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 28:13 "Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy."
- Psalm 51:10 "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me."







Devotional: Repentance: The Path to Freedom and Restoration

Sin unaddressed is another open door. Sometimes, we may be unaware of hidden sins or habitual patterns that give the enemy access. Repentance—turning from sin with a contrite heart—is a powerful way to close these doors.

No matter how deep or frequent the sin, God promises forgiveness and cleansing if we confess honestly. Don't let shame keep you from the healing power of repentance. A broken and humble heart invites God's restoration and protection.

Today, ask God to reveal any sin you need to confess, especially those you have hidden or ignored. Trust in His mercy and offer your full repentance. As you do, the enemy loses his foothold, and your spiritual armor strengthens.

Day 4: A Breaking Occult Ties

Your Verse

Deuteronomy 18:10–12 – "Let no one be found among you who...practices divination or sorcery, interprets omens, engages in witchcraft...Anyone who does these things is detestable to the Lord."

Supporting Scriptures

- Acts 19:18–19 "Many who believed now came and openly confessed what they had done...A number who had practiced sorcery brought their scrolls together and burned them in the sight of all."
- Galatians 5:19–21 "The acts of the flesh are obvious...idolatry and witchcraft...I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God."







Day 4: A Breaking Occult Ties

Devotional: Renouncing Occult Ties for Spiritual Freedom

Exposure to occult practices is a serious spiritual gateway. Whether through curiosity, deception, or past involvement, these ties must be broken completely. The Bible clearly warns against any connection with witchcraft, divination, and related activities.

Breaking free requires confession, renouncement, and spiritual cleansing. Acts 19 shows believers publicly burning objects connected with sorcery, symbolizing their break with past darkness. This act of faith is essential to close the doors the enemy uses to manipulate and oppress.

If you have exposure or involvement with occult or New Age practices, don't despair. God's grace is greater than any darkness. Confess, renounce, and ask the Holy Spirit to fill every place once occupied by these influences. Freedom is possible, and restoration is your God-given right.

- Psalm 144:1 "...Who trains my hands for battle, my fingers for war; He is my loving God and my fortress."







Day 5: **(**) Putting on God's Armor

Devotional: Daily Armor: Prepare for Spiritual Battle

Once doors are closed, the enemy will often try to push back. That is why Scripture emphasizes putting on the full armor of God daily. This armor includes truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the Word of God.

Each piece serves a protective or offensive role. For example, faith serves as a shield to extinguish fiery darts, and the sword of the Spirit represents God's Word, which cuts through deception and doubt.

Today, meditate on the pieces of armor and examine if you are consciously putting them on each day. Are you daily feeding your spirit with the Word? Are you standing firm in truth and faith? The enemy will respect a warrior clad in God's armor and stand no chance against you when you wield these weapons in prayer and obedience.

Spiritual gateways often open through the mind. Negative thought patterns, lies, or worldly perspectives can provide access for the enemy's influence. That's why renewing the mind is key in spiritual warfare.

Renewal happens as we replace lies with Scripture, practice capturing every thought, and focus on what is pure and godly. This discipline retrains our brain and spirit, strengthening our defenses.

Today, be intentional about what you expose your mind to. Memorize or meditate on verses that affirm your identity and authority in Christ. When tempted, use the sword of the Spirit (God's Word) to speak truth and claim victory.
