Introduction

Grief touches every heart at some point in life, especially when disasters strike communities worldwide. For believers, the pain of loss is intertwined with hope in Christ, who comforts and sustains us through trials. As members of the global Church, we are called not only to grieve but also to embody God's love by supporting one another and praying fervently for healing and restoration.

In this 7-day study, we will journey through Scripture to understand how God comforts His people in times of profound sorrow and how the Church, as His body, can minister effectively after disasters. We will explore the promises God makes about His presence in suffering, the hope of resurrection, and practical ways to intercede for those devastated by tragedy.

Each day's devotion will encourage you to pray specifically for the global Church's response to disasters—prayers for healing, unity, provision, and renewed faith. Together, let us deepen our trust in God's faithfulness and commit ourselves to being His compassionate hands and feet to a hurting world.

















Day 1: W God's Presence in Our Grief

Your Verse

Psalm 34:18 - "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 "God comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble."







Day 1: W God's Presence in Our Grief

Devotional: Experiencing God Nearness in Brokenness

Grief often feels isolating and overwhelming, but Scripture assures us of God's nearness during these painful moments. Psalm 34:18 reminds us that God is especially close to those who are brokenhearted—He does not turn away or hide. In the midst of loss, He offers comfort and salvation to the crushed in spirit.

As we pray for the global Church after disasters, it is vital to remember that God is intimately present with His people everywhere. The suffering are not forgotten or abandoned; rather, God is actively close, bringing healing even when circumstances seem hopeless. This truth sustains the Church's faith and fuels compassionate ministry.

Let us today seek and celebrate God's closeness and pray for the global Church to fully experience His comforting presence and to extend that blessing to others in grief around them.

Day 2: **B** Finding Hope Amid Sorrow

Devotional: Rooted in Christ's Hope During Trials

Grief can cloud our vision with despair, but the Bible points us to a hope that transcends our pain. Romans 15:13 prays that God, the source of hope, will fill believers with joy and peace as they trust Him. This hope is not naïve positivity, but a confident assurance in God's character and promises.

Jesus acknowledged the troubles we face but encouraged His followers to find peace in Him (John 16:33). The promise in Revelation that God will one day wipe away all tears reminds the Church worldwide that suffering is temporary and that eternal restoration awaits.

When disaster strikes, we must anchor our faith and prayers in this hope, encouraging those who mourn to trust God's greater plan and future glory. It is a hope that binds the global Church together in unity and resilience.

Day 3: Ծ The Church as a Healing Body

Devotional: United in Compassion and Support

The Church is a living body, interconnected and interdependent. When one member suffers, the entire body feels it deeply (1 Corinthians 12:26). This reality is profoundly true when disasters cause widespread grief.

God commands His people to bear each other's burdens (Galatians 6:2), practicing tangible love and empathy. As the body builds itself up in love (Ephesians 4:16), the global Church's response to disaster is an opportunity to model Christ's compassion and bring healing to hurting lives.

Praying for unity and effective ministry, believers can become powerful instruments of restoration—offering prayer, support, encouragement, and practical aid wherever devastation has struck.

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 "God of all comfort, who comforts us..."
- Psalm 147:3 "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds."







Day 4: 🐧 Comfort for the Mourning

Devotional: God's Promise to Soothe Grieving Hearts

Jesus pronounces a blessing on those who mourn, promising comfort (Matthew 5:4). This assurance reminds us that grief is recognized by God and that He actively ministers to the sorrowful.

The Apostle Paul calls God the "God of all comfort" —one who not only comforts us in hardship but equips us to comfort others (2 Corinthians 1:3–4). Psalm 147:3 beautifully describes God's tender care in healing broken hearts and binding wounds.

As we pray for disaster-stricken communities, may the global Church be vessels of this divine comfort. Let us ask God to heal wounds, restore hope, and flood hearts with His peace and love.

Devotional: Praying Boldly for the Global Church

Prayer is a vital tool God has given us to support one another, especially in times of crisis. Paul's earnest prayers for the Colossian church (Colossians 1:9) exemplify how believers intercede for faith, wisdom, and strength.

Scripture urges us to pray for all people with intercession and thanksgiving (1 Timothy 2:1), and assures us that righteous prayer is powerful (James 5:16). As the global Church faces disasters, interceding with compassion aligns us with God's heart and purposes.

Today, commit to praying boldly for those affected: that God would renew their hope, provide physical and spiritual needs, and unite believers in loving service.

James 1:27 - "Religion that God our Father accepts... is to look after orphans and widows..."

Supporting Scriptures

- Matthew 25:40 "Whatever you did for one of the least of these... you did for me."
- Galatians 5:13 "Serve one another humbly in love."







Devotional: Active Faith through Service

Faith is not only felt but expressed in action—especially in supporting those suffering after disasters. James defines true faith as caring for the vulnerable (James 1:27). Jesus teaches that serving the least is serving Him personally (Matthew 25:40).

Paul exhorts believers to serve one another with humble love (Galatians 5:13). When the Church acts in unity and compassion, it demonstrates hope to broken communities and glorifies God through compassionate deeds.

Pray and seek ways the global Church can be mobilized for service, meeting both physical and spiritual needs in disaster recovery.

What personal gifts or resources could you offer in service to those in grief?

Devotional: Hope in God's Redeeming Work

After grief and loss, God promises renewal. Isaiah 43:18-19 speaks of God doing something new, inviting us to perceive His transforming work amid hardship.

Lamentations reminds us that God's mercies are new every morning, providing fresh hope daily. Through Christ, believers become new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17), empowered to move forward in faith and restoration.

End this study by praying for the global Church to embrace God's new work, to rise from sorrow to renewed purpose, and to be a vibrant witness of His redemption to the world.

3.	How does embracing God's mercy help personal and communal healing?
