Day 2: <a> Consistent Discipline with Love

Devotional: Discipline: Love's Tough but Tender Tool

Discipline is an essential, yet often difficult, part of parenting. Hebrews 12:11 reminds us that discipline is not enjoyable in the moment but yields lasting peace and righteousness. This teaches us that discipline is not punishment but training — a loving act aimed at helping our children grow and learn.

The balance comes in exercising discipline with compassion. Proverbs 13:24 challenges us that discipline is an expression of love, not neglect or anger. Our children need boundaries consistently applied, but also grace-filled correction that reflects God's heart.

Psalm 103:13 beautifully illustrates God's compassionate nature toward us as His children.
