Introduction

Facing bullies can be one of the most challenging experiences for children, stirring feelings of fear, loneliness, and confusion. This Bible study plan is crafted to equip young hearts with courage and confidence—not just based on their own strength, but on the powerful promises found in God's Word. *Children* often face peer pressure and bullying, but through Scripture, they can learn how to respond with bravery, kindness, and wisdom.

This study will gently walk children and their guides through stories, verses, and truths that reveal how God views them—as beloved, brave, and strong. Each day offers a primary passage, supporting scriptures, and thought-provoking devotional content to encourage reflection and growth. The prayers and journaling prompts provide a safe space to express feelings and seek God's guidance.

With God's help, bullies do not have to control your feelings or your actions. Instead, you can stand firm, speak truth in love, and trust that God is your protector. This plan aims to transform fear into faith, and helplessness into hope. Whether a child reads this alone or together with a parent, teacher, or mentor, it will cultivate resilience and courage grounded in divine strength.

Let's take these next seven days to explore God's Word about facing challenges, standing strong, and embracing the incredible courage God places in each of us. Get ready to be empowered, encouraged, and equipped to face bullies with a brave heart.

















Your Verse

Psalm 46:1 - God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God.
- 2 Timothy 1:7 For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.







Devotional: God's Strength Helps Us Overcome Fear

When bullies make us feel afraid, it's natural to want to hide or run away. But God promises that He is our ever-present help — meaning He is always close, ready to protect and give us strength. Whether the challenge feels big or small, you are never alone. The Bible reminds us that God's Spirit is not one of fear, but of power and love. That means with God's strength, you can stand firm without being scared. Courage doesn't mean you aren't afraid; it means you trust God even when you are.

Today, remember that God is your mighty shield, and He will help you face whatever hard days come your way. When you feel alone or worried, call on Him, and He will be your refuge and strength.

Your Verse

Proverbs 15:1 - A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

Supporting Scriptures

- Ephesians 4:29 Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up.
- Colossians 4:6 Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt.







Devotional: Courage Shines Through Gentle Words

When we face bullies, our first reaction might be to lash back or stay silent out of fear. But God encourages us to respond with gentle and kind words. Proverbs reminds us that kindness can calm anger and change the way others treat us. Using our words to build others up even when they hurt us is a powerful way to show courage.

Choosing to speak with grace helps us stand out with God's love in the midst of difficult situations. It doesn't mean accepting bad behavior, but rather, setting a tone that can stop bullying in its tracks. When you feel scared, pray for God to help you speak the right words — words that can bring peace and show your strength.

Your Verse

Proverbs 3:5-6 - Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding.

Supporting Scriptures

- James 1:5 If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault.
- Psalm 27:1 The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?







Devotional: Seek God's Wisdom When Facing Challenges

Wise courage means asking God for guidance when you're unsure how to respond. Proverbs teaches us not to rely only on what we think but to trust fully in God's understanding. When bullies come around, it's easy to feel confused about what to do. God's wisdom can light the path and help us make choices that keep us safe and strong.

James encourages us to ask God for wisdom—He gladly gives it to those who seek. Having wisdom doesn't mean you have to face bullying alone or fight back in anger; it means you find the best way to handle the situation with God's help, whether that's telling a trusted adult or praying for courage. Remember, with God as your light and salvation, there is no fear too big to face.

- James 5:16 Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed.







Devotional: Strength in Friendship and Support

No one is meant to face struggles alone, especially bullying. The Bible tells us that having friends and trusted adults beside us provides support and strength to stand through hard times. When you feel bullied, don't keep your pain a secret—talk to someone who cares. Together, you can find solutions, comfort, and renewed courage.

God designed us for community and encourages us to carry each other's burdens. Leaning on God and those who love you brings healing and hope. This doesn't make you weak; it shows bravery to ask for help and trust others with your feelings. Remember, when you fall, God often uses friends to help lift you up.

Romans 12:17-18 - Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone.

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Peter 3:9 Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing.
- Matthew 5:44 Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.







Devotional: Peaceful Courage Transforms Conflict

It can be very hard to face bullies without wanting to fight back or be mean in return. But Scripture teaches us a different way—one of standing firm in what is right while responding with love and blessing, not anger. This kind of courage is powerful and reflects God's heart.

Choosing not to repay evil with evil doesn't mean you accept wrong or allow bullying to continue. It means you hold your ground peacefully and trust God to bring justice. Loving your enemies and praying for them transforms your heart and can soften even the hardest situations. This takes real courage—but remember, God is with you every step of the way.

Devotional: You Are Wonderfully Made and Loved
