Introduction

Welcome to this 21-day Bible study on Courage for Pastors and Leaders.

Devotional: Strength Through God's Presence

Starting your journey in courage requires remembering that God's presence is your greatest source of strength. Joshua was stepping into huge shoes, leading Israel into unknown territory. God's command to him was clear: be strong and courageous because He would never leave or forsake him. As pastors and leaders, God calls us to the same confidence.

Leadership often places us in unfamiliar or challenging situations where fear can creep in. But like Joshua, we can remember God's faithful presence. When you feel overwhelmed, pause and recall that God is with you. His power surpasses your limitations, and His Spirit equips you for every task.

Take heart today knowing that courage does not come from your own bravery, but from God's steadfast presence that surrounds and strengthens you.

Devotional: Boldness to Speak God's Word

As pastors and leaders, delivering God's message sometimes requires confronting indifference, criticism, or rejection. Boldness is a gift from the Spirit that empowers us to speak with love, clarity, and conviction. It is not arrogance but courageous humility rooted in God's authority.

Ask God to equip you with boldness that reflects His power and love as you minister.

Devotional: Leading with Unwavering Integrity

Leadership places you under scrutiny. Integrity guards your ministry from compromise and builds trust within your community. Courage to lead with integrity means choosing God's ways even when expedient or popular shortcuts beckon. It means standing firm in truth, humility, and service.

Pray for strength to lead a life above reproach that inspires trust and honors God.

Devotional: God's Power in Your Weakness

Leadership is demanding and can lead to exhaustion or discouragement. Admitting weakness isn't failure; it's trusting God to work through your vulnerabilities. True courage flows from dependence on His grace, which transforms fragility into power.

Serving humbly may require stepping down from the spotlight, listening actively, and meeting practical needs without complaint. Such servanthearted leadership builds trust, fosters unity, and reflects Christ's character.

Ask God to cultivate a servant's heart that leads courageously through humility.
