Your Verse

Joshua 1:9 - "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Supporting Scriptures

- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God."
- Psalm 27:1 "The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?" The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?"







Devotional: Rely on God's Presence for Boldness

Starting your courage journey means remembering who gives you your strength. Joshua's charge from God reminds us that courage isn't about fearless independence but confident reliance on God's presence and promises. Just as God encouraged Joshua facing enormous challenges to lead the people into the Promised Land, you too are called to be strong and courageous in your daily life, especially as a student.

You don't have to face fears or doubts alone. Whether it's fear of failure, social pressures, or standing up for what's right, God's command is clear: be brave because He is with you. This presence transforms fear into boldness and discouragement into hope.

Ask yourself: In what areas of student life do I feel afraid or discouraged? How can trusting God's presence change the way I approach these situations? By daily inviting God's strength, your courage becomes a living testimony of faith.

3.	How can God's promises encourage you to overcome discouragement?

Prayer for Today

Teach me to rely on You first and to trust that You will guide me in every challenge I face as a student. *Give me courage today and every day*, knowing You are my refuge and strength. Day 2: 6 Courage to Stand for Truth

Your Verse

Daniel 3:16-18 - "Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego replied, 'If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us... But even if He does not... we will not serve your gods.""

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 16:13 "Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong."
- Ephesians 6:13 "Put on the full armor of God... so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes."







Day 2: 6 Courage to Stand for Truth

Devotional: Boldness in Living God's Truth

Standing up for your beliefs can be one of the hardest acts of courage, especially among peers. Daniel's friends faced a terrifying choice: bow to a false god or face death. Their unwavering courage came from faith that God was able to save them—and a fearless commitment to obey, even if He didn't.

For students, this might mean standing firm against peer pressure, dishonesty, or anything that compromises your values. Courage is not just about the outcome but about your commitment to God's truth, no matter the cost.

This passage challenges you to consider your own convictions. Are you willing to stand strong, even if it feels isolating or risky? God equips you with His armor and Spirit to stand firm; you never face opposition alone.

Day 2: 🖰 Courage to Stand for Truth


Prayer for Today

Day 3: X Courage to Face the Unknown

Devotional: Trust God When Facing Uncertainty

Life as a student is full of unknowns—upcoming tests, social situations, future plans, and more. Fear of the unknown can easily rob you of peace and courage. But God teaches us a simple, powerful response: *when afraid, choose to trust in Him.*

Psalm 56 represents that heartfelt cry to God in fear and the choice to rely on Him instead of our scattered thoughts or worries. Trusting God in uncertainty doesn't mean you won't feel fear, but it means you won't be controlled by it.

Imagine what freedom comes from handing your fears over to God daily. This trust deepens courage because God holds your future securely. How can you practice trusting God more when you feel anxious about what lies ahead?

Your Verse

Ephesians 6:10-11 - "Be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes."

Supporting Scriptures

- 2 Timothy 1:7 "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."
- James 4:7 "Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you."







Day 4: 💥 Courage in Spiritual Battles

Devotional: Gear Up with God's Armor Daily

Not all battles we face as students are visible. The Scriptures remind us that spiritual battles against doubt, temptation, fear, and discouragement require courage backed by God's power.

Paul's call to "put on the full armor of God" shows that courage in these battles isn't by our own strength but through living in God's protection: truth, righteousness, faith, and the Word.

God's Spirit empowers us with courage, love, and self-discipline. This means courage is accompanied by inner peace and wise choices, enabling you to stand firm even when spiritual challenges arise among friends, online, or in private moments.

Prayer, Scripture, and community are weapons of courage available to you. How can you actively strengthen your spiritual courage each day?

Devotional: Live Boldly as God's Light
