Day 1: The Source of Courage

Devotional: God Is Your Unfailing Strength

Leadership requires courage, but where do we find it? Joshua 1:9 reminds us that God commands us to be strong and courageous—not from our own power, but because He promises to be with us wherever we go. This promise is profound for ministry leaders called to face uncertainties and opposition.

Imagine stepping into a new ministry role, surrounded by unknown challenges—will you have the strength? God's assurance means we do not need to rely on our own might or wisdom. Devotional: Led by the Spirit's Bold Power

Leading a ministry courageously depends on the Holy Spirit's empowerment. In Acts 4, the early believers faced persecution but prayed for courage to speak God's word boldly. Their place was shaken, and they were filled with the Spirit—resulting in fearless proclamation.

Like them, you need the Spirit's boldness to lead against opposition and uncertainty. Leadership isn't about self-confidence but Spirit-filled courage. 2 Timothy 1:7 reminds us that God's Spirit gives power and love, not timidity.

- Psalm 119:11 "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you."
- Philippians 4:7 "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."







Day 15: ① Guarding Your Heart

Devotional: Protecting Your Inner Strength

A courageous leader must guard their heart diligently. Proverbs 4:23 highlights the importance of protecting the source of life and strength within —your heart. Ministry can expose leaders to discouragement, offense, and temptation.
