Your Verse

Joshua 1:9 - "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Supporting Scriptures

- Psalm 27:1 "The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?"
- Isaiah 41:10 "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."







Day 1: ① Courage Starts with God's Strength

Devotional: God's Strength Fuels Our Courage

Parenting can stir up fears—fear of failure, fear of not being enough, or fear that the world may overpower the spiritual foundation we hope to build. However, the first step toward courage in raising godly children is recognizing that God has already equipped us. In Joshua 1:9, God commands Joshua to be strong and courageous—not based on his own power but on God's presence.

What an encouraging truth! God promises to be with us wherever we go, including every parenting moment. Courage does not mean absence of fear but choosing to trust God despite fears. When you feel overwhelmed by the responsibility of raising your children in faith, recall that God is your source of strength and courage.

Today, rest in God's assurance and invite His strength to fill your heart. When doubts or worries arise, remind yourself that the Lord is your stronghold. Parenting isn't a solitary journey; it's a partnership with the Almighty.

Your Verse

Deuteronomy 6:6-7 - "These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 22:6 "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it."
- Ephesians 6:4 "Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."







Devotional: Boldly Embed God's Word in Daily Life

One crucial aspect of courage in parenting is **boldly teaching God's Word** to our children. Deuteronomy 6 calls us to intentionally impress God's commandments on our children's hearts throughout daily life—while sitting, walking, rising, and sleeping. This continual, purposeful teaching can be daunting amidst busy schedules and distractions.

Yet, courage is required to consistently prioritize Scripture, even when cultural messages seem contrary or your child's questions challenge your own understanding. Trust that planting these seeds of faith will bear fruit over time. The promise in Proverbs 22:6 encourages us that early guidance rooted in God's ways will stay with them throughout life.

Boldness also means addressing their behavior with love and patience (Ephesians 6:4), not provoking frustration. By immersing your family in God's truths, you create a firm foundation that prepares them to face the world. Embrace this calling with confidence, knowing the Holy Spirit equips you to be a spiritual teacher and role model.

Your Verse

2 Timothy 1:7 - "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."

Supporting Scriptures

- Galatians 5:22–23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control."
- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."







Devotional: Courage to Cultivate Godly Character

Raising children with godly character requires courage to cultivate qualities that often contrast with worldly values. 2 Timothy 1:7 reminds us that God's Spirit empowers us with power, love, and *self-discipline*—essential traits for parenting well. When guiding your children, courage involves modeling and encouraging the fruit of the Spirit listed in Galatians 5. These are not built overnight but require patience and perseverance.

Sometimes, it means making tough choices or standing firm when your children may resist or question your guidance. Trusting God wholeheartedly, as Proverbs 3 instructs, helps us navigate these moments with wisdom. We cannot lean on our own understanding but must submit these parenting challenges to God to direct our path.

This day invites you to consider how your own character aligns with what you want to teach your children, recognizing that courageous parenting begins with living out faith authentically and dependently on God.

Your Verse

Ephesians 6:13 – "Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand."

Supporting Scriptures

- 1 Corinthians 16:13 "Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong."
- James 1:5 "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you."







Day 4: 6 Standing Firm in Faith Amid Challenges

Devotional: Put On God's Armor and Stand Firm

Parenting godly children means facing spiritual battles—temptations, cultural pressures, and internal doubts. Ephesians 6 encourages us to put on the full armor of God so that we can stand firm when challenges come. Courage in parenting is about preparedness—arming ourselves with truth, righteousness, and prayer.

It also means staying vigilant and active in faith, as 1 Corinthians 16 exhorts us to be courageous and strong. These days require more than passive hope; they call us to action. Devotional: Love: The Heart of Courageous Parenting

Courage in parenting is not just about standing strong but also about leading with love. 1 Corinthians 13 beautifully describes love's enduring qualities—patience, kindness, perseverance—that every parent needs to emulate. Raising godly children requires courageous love that persists even when challenges test our patience or tempt us toward frustration.

Colossians 3 cautions parents not to embitter their children but to foster encouragement and affirmation. Too often, the discipline or standards we establish can cause discouragement if not balanced with love. Courageous parenting means loving boldly — setting boundaries while also nurturing hearts.

Jesus commands us to love as He has loved, a love that sacrifices and perseveres without giving up. This divine love strengthens and sustains our efforts. As we lead with love, we create an environment where children feel secure, valued, and motivated to follow God's ways.

Today, make prayer your first response rather than your last resort. Cultivate confidence that God listens and works behind the scenes. Courage to raise godly children flourishes when anchored in the habit of consistent, heartfelt prayer.
