Your Verse

Joshua 1:9 - "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Psalm 27:1 - "The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid?"*
- *2 Timothy 1:7 - "For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline."*



Day 1: 🐯 God's Gift of Courage

Devotional: Embracing God's Strength for Boldness

Courage starts with God's command and promise. In Joshua 1:9, God charges Joshua to be strong and courageous—reminding him that fear and discouragement have no place because God is with him wherever he goes. This isn't just for ancient leaders. It's for you, too, especially in your workplace.

Speaking truth can feel risky: Will I offend? Lose my job? Be misunderstood? These fears can silence us. But God's Spirit empowers us differently. 2 Timothy 1:7 reassures that God gives us power, love, and self-discipline—not a spirit of fear.

This means courage in the workplace isn't about recklessness or loudness; it's about *quiet confidence rooted in God's presence*. When facing tough conversations or the temptation to stay silent, remember that God equips you. Your courage is His gift, not just your own strength.

Your Verse

Ephesians 4:15 - "Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Proverbs 15:1 - "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger."*
- *Colossians 4:6 - "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."*



Devotional: Balancing Boldness with Love and Grace

Courageous speech isn't just about blunt honesty—it's about truth spoken with love. Ephesians 4:15 teaches us that truth and love go hand in hand. When we stand up for what is right at work, the way we say things matters deeply. Our goal is to build up others, not tear down.

Proverbs 15:1 contrasts gentle answers with harsh words. Even if the truth is difficult, approaching others with kindness can diffuse anger and open hearts. Colossians 4:6 encourages us to fill our conversations with grace — making our truth more palatable and effective.

Being courageous means being vulnerable enough to be honest, yet humble enough to listen, understand, and respond with compassion. In your workplace, this balance between boldness and love will reflect Christ's character and open doors for positive change.

Day 3: 🛡️ Overcoming Fear with Faith



Your Verse

Isaiah 41:10 - "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Psalm 56:3 - "When I am afraid, I put my trust in you."*
- *1 John 4:18 - "There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear..."*



Devotional: Replacing Fear with Trust and God's Strength

Fear is a natural reaction to risky situations, but God calls us to a different response. Isaiah 41:10 provides a reassuring promise: God's presence means we don't need to fear or feel dismayed. Instead, He offers strength, help, and support just when we need it most.

In the workplace, fear of rejection, conflict, or consequences can paralyze us. Psalm 56:3 gives us a simple but profound strategy — whenever afraid, put your trust in God. This act shifts our focus from the problem to the Problem Solver.

1 John 4:18 reminds us that God's perfect love drives out fear. When we dwell on His love—knowing He understands and cares—we can stand firm to speak truth with confidence and peace.



Reflect and Apply

1. What specific fears do I struggle with when thinking about speaking truth at work?

2. How can trusting God help me face those fears?

3. What does it mean to experience God's perfect love in the context of my workplace challenges?



Journaling Prompts

1. Identify fears that keep you silent and write a prayer surrendering them to God.

2. Describe a time when trusting God helped you be courageous.

3. List ways to remind yourself of God's presence during difficult conversations.



Prayer for Today

Lord, when fear tries to silence me, remind me that You are near. Strengthen me with Your power and uphold me with Your righteous hand. Fill my heart with Your perfect love that casts out fear. Day 4: Integrity: The Foundation of Courage



Your Verse

Proverbs 10:9 – "Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but whoever takes crooked paths will be found out."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Psalm 15:1-2 – "LORD, who may dwell in your sacred tent? ... The one whose walk is blameless, who does what is righteous..."*
- *1 Peter 3:16 – "Keep a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed."*



Devotional: Living with Integrity Builds Courage and Confidence

Walking with integrity means being truthful in word and deed. Proverbs 10:9 states that walking in integrity brings security—an inner confidence that supports courageous speech. When your character is consistent with your values, you stand firm in who you are, even when others might oppose you.

Psalm 15 highlights the kind of person who dwells with God: one who lives blamelessly and righteously. This godly character forms the foundation for courageous truth-telling, especially in complex workplace environments.

1 Peter 3:16 encourages us to keep a clear conscience so that even negative opposition can't shake our testimony. Integrity protects our witness and emboldens our voice, giving us strength to speak honestly and bravely for what is right.



Reflect and Apply

1. How does integrity in my daily actions affect my ability to speak truth at work?

2. Are there areas where I need to align more closely with God's standards?

3. How can a clear conscience empower me to face opposition without fear?



Journaling Prompts

1. Reflect on times when integrity strengthened your courage.

2. Evaluate your current workplace behaviors—do they reflect integrity?

3. Set specific goals to live with greater integrity this week.

Day 5: 🌿 Trusting God's Timing



Your Verse

Ecclesiastes 3:1 - "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens."

Supporting Scriptures

- *Psalm 27:14 - "Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD."*
- *Galatians 6:9 - "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."*



Devotional: Patience and Timing in Speaking Truth

Courage also means knowing when to speak and when to wait. Ecclesiastes 3:1 reminds us that everything has its right time and season. In the workplace, rushing to say something without wisdom can backfire, while well-timed truth can produce great fruit.

Psalm 27:14 encourages us to wait on the Lord—to patiently trust His timing. This requires strength and courage, as waiting can feel uncertain and difficult.

Galatians 6:9 reassures us not to grow weary in doing good and speaking truth. Even when results aren't immediate, trust that perseverance will bring a harvest. God's timing is perfect, and waiting on Him prepares your heart and words to be effective and impactful.

3. What can I do to grow patience while still seeking to do good?



Journaling Prompts

2. Describe how waiting has helped improve a past situation.

3. Plan ways to stay strong and hopeful during times of waiting.

Your Verse

Acts 4:29 – "Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness."

Supporting Scriptures

- *1 Corinthians 16:13 – "Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong."*
- *James 1:12 – "Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life..."*



Devotional: Boldness When Facing Workplace Challenges

Speaking the truth may bring opposition, but God empowers us to stand firm. In Acts 4:29, the early believers prayed for boldness despite threats. This same boldness is available to you as you speak truth in your workplace.

1 Corinthians 16:13 commands us to be alert, stand firm in faith, and be courageous. Courage here is an active choice—a posture that refuses to shrink despite challenges.

James 1:12 encourages perseverance under trial, promising a great reward for those who endure. When faced with pushback, remember that standing firm honors God and grows your character. Let adversities refine your courage, not diminish it.

Your Verse

- *Matthew 5:16 - "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."*
- *Philippians 1:27 - "...to conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ."*



Devotional: Courageous Ambassadors for Christ at Work

As followers of Christ, our workplace courage reflects our identity as His ambassadors. 2 Corinthians 5:20 calls us to represent Christ boldly, making God's appeal through our words and actions.

Matthew 5:16 urges us to let our light shine, demonstrating our faith through good deeds and truthful speech that glorify God. This shining requires courage — the willingness to stand out and sometimes face challenges because of our convictions.

Philippians 1:27 reminds us to live worthy of the gospel, meaning integrity, love, and courage all together. When you speak truth at work, you're not just advocating for honesty—you're inviting reconciliation, healing, and transformation.

Embrace your role as God's ambassador. Speak with courage, faith, and love, knowing your words carry eternal significance.
