Day 1: ① Embraced by God's Strength

Devotional: Finding Courage in God's Promises

Stepping into leadership roles, especially in male-dominated fields, can be intimidating. Doubts may arise about whether you have what it takes or fear of rejection and failure may creep in. Yet, God's Word reassures us powerfully: *We do not walk this path alone.*

Isaiah 41:10 reminds us that God's presence replaces fear with peace and power. When anxiety builds, this promise can anchor your heart. God calls you to operate from His strength, not your own, and to stand firm knowing that He goes before you.

Imagine that every step you take is supported by the Creator of the universe, who delights in your success and will never abandon you. This doesn't mean the journey will be easy, but it means the God of heaven empowers you to overcome challenges with boldness.

Day 2: 6 Boldness to Speak Up









Your Verse

Esther 4:14 - "Perhaps this is the moment for which you have been created."

Supporting Scriptures

- Proverbs 31:26 "She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue."
- Acts 4:29 "Enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness."







Devotional: Finding Your Voice with God's Boldness

Leadership requires more than skills; it demands boldness to speak up for what is right and necessary. Esther's story speaks profoundly to women stepping into difficult roles. Faced with immense risk, she chose to lean into her God-given purpose rather than shrink back.

When you face intimidating boardrooms or challenging conversations as a woman in a male-dominated workplace, remember Esther's courage. She recognized her influence and realized her voice mattered at critical moments.

Proverbs 31:26 reminds us that speaking with wisdom and instruction is a beautiful mark of godly leadership. This boldness isn't brashness but a firm, calm confidence in God's guidance.

Ask God to fill you with His wisdom and boldness to speak up with clarity and grace. You have a voice for a reason — to influence, inspire, and lead with integrity in every conversation.

- Titus 2:7 "In everything set them an example by doing what is good."







Devotional: Integrity: The Heart of Godly Leadership

Integrity is the foundation of trustworthy leadership. As you lead in challenging environments, maintaining your character under pressure is both difficult and essential.

Devotional: Your God-Given Leadership Gifts

Devotional: Seeking God's Wisdom Daily

James 1:5 assures that we can ask God for wisdom freely and receive it generously. Trusting God fully, as Proverbs 3 teaches, directs our paths and grounds our decisions in His guidance rather than anxiety.

Colossians emphasizes praying for spiritual understanding—seeing beyond just practical outcomes to God's bigger purpose.

Today, approach each decision with prayer and openness to divine wisdom. Invite God to illuminate your path and help you lead in ways that honor Him and serve others well.
