Devotional: Communicating With Compassion Builds Peace

Miscommunication feeds confusion and insecurity; by contrast, clear and loving dialogue builds trust and safety for everyone in the family.

- Ephesians 4:29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up."
- Colossians 3:16 "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom."







Devotional: Healing Power of Affirming Words

Our words have the power to build up or tear down. Affirming words in marriage can heal wounds, increase intimacy, and foster security for your children.

Children gravitate toward homes where kindness and encouragement flow freely. When spouses deliberately speak words of affirmation, it creates a warm atmosphere that deflates anxiety and encourages healthy emotional development.

Challenge yourself to speak healing, life-giving words to your spouse daily.
