### Devotional: Renew Your Mind with God's Truth

Day 2: V Strength in God's Protection

# Devotional: Finding Joy in God's Shelter

**Feeling vulnerable to criticism is natural,** but God calls us to find joy and safety in Him as our refuge. Psalm 5:11 encourages us to rejoice in the protection God provides when harsh words or judgments come our way.

God watches over us with tender care—like a mother bird sheltering her young. This imagery reminds us that even when criticism pierces deeply, we are never truly alone or unprotected.

Moreover, 2 Timothy 1:7 reveals that God empowers us with strength, love, and self-control. The fear or shame criticism might plant can be replaced by courage and calmness fueled by the Holy Spirit.

Today, rest in God's promise of protection. Remember that your worth is secure in Him and that He strengthens you to respond thoughtfully rather than react impulsively.

- Ecclesiastes 7:9 "Do not be quickly provoked in your spirit, for anger resides in the lap of fools."







### Devotional: Choose Gentle Words Over Anger

**Criticism can tempt us to react defensively or harshly,** but Scripture guides us toward wisdom and self-control. Proverbs 15:1 shows us how a gentle answer can prevent conflict and calm heated situations.

James 1:19 encourages us to listen carefully before responding and to manage our anger. Often, our pride or hurt feelings push us toward angry words that escalate tension.

Ecclesiastes 7:9 warns against quick temper, reminding us that patience and thoughtful responses reflect wisdom. By pausing and choosing our words carefully, we demonstrate maturity and embody Christ's love.

Today, ask God to help you respond with grace and gentleness. Practice listening before replying and seek to diffuse criticism rather than fuel it.

# Devotional: Stand Strong with God's Presence

### Devotional: Grow Stronger through Humble Trust

**Criticism, though hard, can be a tool for growth,** especially when met with humility. Proverbs 3:5–6 teaches us to trust in God rather than our own understanding, a key principle for learning from feedback without bitterness.

James 4:6 reminds us that God favors the humble and resists the proud. Pride can blind us to valuable lessons, while humility opens our hearts to transformation.

Romans 5 encourages us that suffering, including criticism, produces perseverance and character, which lead to hope. Embracing humility allows us to see criticism as refining fire rather than destructive force.
