Understanding Deborah's leadership begins with understanding the deep trouble Israel faced. Their repeated pattern of disobedience led to cycles of oppression. After Ehud's death, Israel again turned away from God, and the Lord allowed King Jabin to dominate them harshly.

This context of hardship reveals God's justice—He permits consequences but also offers redemption. Even in bondage, God was actively working behind the scenes, preparing Deborah and Barak to rise as deliverers. God's timing is perfect; He allows these struggles to refine His people and reveal His power.
