Day 1: Introduction to 1 Corinthians



Your Verse

1 Corinthians 1:1-9 NIV – Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, to the church of God in Corinth: to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be his holy people, together with all those everywhere who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ...

Supporting Scriptures

- *Romans 1:1 – Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God.*
- *2 Timothy 3:16 – All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness.*



Devotional: Called and Equipped by God's Grace

Paul's authoritative yet loving introduction sets the tone for the entire letter. He begins by reminding the Corinthians of their identity in Christ as "sanctified" and "called to be holy." This suggests that Christian life is about being set apart—not just in name, but in action and heart.

The greeting includes a reminder that believers everywhere share this calling, framing the letter not only as local advice but as universal truth for the body of Christ. Paul also expresses gratitude for their spiritual gifts and God's faithfulness, which encourages us to reflect on how God has been present in our own spiritual journeys.

Notice Paul's emphasis on grace and faithfulness. Despite the challenges he will address later, he acknowledges God's provision, encouraging believers that they are equipped for every good work.

As we start this study, let's open our hearts to learning and growing in unity, truth, and love just as Paul desires for the Corinthian church.

Your Verse

1 Corinthians 1:18-31 NIV – For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God...

Supporting Scriptures

- *Proverbs 3:5 – Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding.*
- *James 1:5 – If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault.*



Day 2: ✨ God's Wisdom vs. Worldly Wisdom

Devotional: Embracing God's Wise Foolishness

This passage confronts the tension between God's wisdom and human wisdom. Paul explains that the gospel—the message of the cross—appears foolish to the world but is the ultimate demonstration of God's power for salvation.

In Corinth, where intellectual prowess and rhetorical skill were highly valued, the scandal of a crucified Messiah seemed absurd. Yet, Paul reminds believers that God's ways often defy worldly expectations, inviting us to trust divine wisdom rather than human logic.

Reflect on how sometimes God's answers don't align with cultural values or personal expectations. Faith calls us to embrace the 'foolishness' of Christ's love and sacrifice because it leads to true life.

Let this truth encourage you today to lean on God's wisdom in difficult decisions and to find strength in His power rather than your own understanding.

Devotional: Building Unity Over Division

Division was a major problem in the Corinthian church. Paul points out their immaturity and quarrels caused by allegiance to different leaders. Instead of seeing themselves as one body, they were fragmented by human loyalties.

This serves as a powerful reminder that unity in the church is essential and requires spiritual maturity, humility, and a focus on Christ rather than personalities.

Consider how our own communities can experience division and how God calls us to be peacemakers and builders of unity. Our work in the church reflects how the world perceives the power of the gospel.

Paul's counsel is to embrace cooperation, recognizing that both leaders and members are servants working with God's purpose.

Paul uses the metaphor of building to teach about the church's foundation. Jesus Christ is the unshakable foundation on which believers build their lives and ministries.

Each person's work will be tested by fire—symbolizing God's judgment of our deeds and motivations. This calls us to build carefully, focusing on lasting, godly impact rather than merely human approval or success.

This passage encourages accountability, reminding us that our efforts must be rooted in truth and empowered by God's grace.

The cross represents both scandal and salvation — suffering and victory intertwined. It confronts human pride and reveals God's incredible love and justice.
