Recognizing our rebellion is the first step toward restoration. Israel's sins were many—idolatry, injustice, and hypocrisy. The message rings true today: our sinful choices separate us from a holy God (Romans 3:23). But God's complaint is not the final word. It is an invitation to repentance and healing.
