Devotional: Loving Discipline Leads to True Wisdom

Devotional: Endurance Builds Maturity and Hope

Devotional: Walking in God's Spirit to Master Self-Control

Paul's commitment in 1 Corinthians 9:27 shows the importance of disciplining ourselves to stay faithful and effective in our calling. When we lack self-control, we open ourselves to unnecessary risks and distractions, like a city without walls.

The fruit of the Spirit includes self-control—a divine ability that helps us prioritize well-being, work responsibilities, and spiritual devotion. Rather than being slaves to impulses or stress, we can walk in freedom by relying on the Spirit.
